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| English | Write a 'what if it came to life' story about an electrical appliance. | Watch a TV programme or video clip on how something is made and write an explanation text. | Write a 'if it stopped working properly' story about an electrical appliance. |
| Maths | Learn the first 15 prime numbers. | Complete a survey to find out your family's favourite breakfast food. Show your findings in a table and a graph. Write 5 questions to analyse your data. | Who has the longest jump? Estimate first then measure accurately. Record as 142cm, 1.42m or 1m 42cm. |
| Topic | Make an electrical item timeline – find out how something has changed since it was invented. | Teach a sibling or parents 5 new Spanish words – record conversation on paper. Use Google Translate if needed. | Find out how a solar panel works. Present what you find out in an interesting way. |
| Working Together | Search around your house for all the devices that use electricity – try to explain how these devices work. | Create your own invention – think about the likes of Wallace and Gromit – what would help you out on a daily basis? Create an information poster about your new, exciting invention. | Discuss and list ideas on saving electricity in your home. |
