In computing, we will be discovering the wonders of Excel and gaining knowledge on how we can use this to input and present data in a variety of ways. We will be covering the units 'Managing Online Information' and 'Copyright and Ownership' in our online safety lessons.

We are very excited for our residential trip to Kingswood in North Devon. We hope this trip provides children with memories to last a lifetime and the chance to further develop their confidence, teamwork and independence.
