First reading:

Wisdom 18:6-9

'By the same means by which you punished our enemies you called us to yourself and glorified us.'

That night of our liberation was made known beforehand to our fathers, so that they might rejoice in sure knowledge of the oaths in which they trusted. The deliverance of the righteous and the destruction of their enemies were expected by your people. For by the same means by which you punished our enemies you called us to yourself and glorified us. For in secret the holy children of good people offered sacrifices and with one accord agreed to the divine law, that the saints would share alike the same things, both blessings and dangers; and already they were singing the praises of the fathers.

Response: Blessed the people the Lord has chosen as his heritage.

Second Reading: Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19

'He was looking forward to the city whose designer and builder is God.'

Brothers and Sisters: Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. For by it the people of old received their commendation.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he went to live in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God. By faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was past the age, since she considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one man, and him as good as dead, were born descendants as many as the stars of heaven and as many as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.

These all died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth. For people who speak thus make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of that land from which they had gone out, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city.

By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was in the act of offering up his only son, of whom it was said, 'Through Isaac shall your offspring be named.' He considered that God was able even to raise him from the dead, from which, figuratively speaking, he did receive him back.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia.

Stay awake and be ready,

for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.

Gospel Reading: Luke 12:35-40

'You also must be ready.'

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, 'Stay dressed for action and keep your lamps burning, and be like men who are waiting for their master to come home from the wedding feast, so that they may open the door to him at once when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. Truly, I say to you, he will dress himself for service, and have them recline at table, and he will come and serve them. If he comes in the second watch, or in the third, and finds them awake, blessed are those servants! But know this, that if the master of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have left his house to be broken into. You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

REFLECTION

Has it ever occurred to you that life without faith is no life at all? I have often suffered from doubt. Is there a God? Is this time on earth the only time we have? Do we just die and that's it? I believe because I have faith in one man, Jesus Christ, and that belief gives me hope and makes me the person I am. I cannot really imagine a life without that belief because that would destroy my hope and it is hope that drives me onwards.

The story of the Old Testament is a story of Faith and Hope; Abraham and Sarah were old people who never gave up hoping for children. Because of their faith in God, they left their native land and wandered the deserts of the Middle East searching for something they could not see, hoping for something, a child, which they could not conceive. God gave them the blessing of a child in old age and that proved to them that faith and hope are never in vain. We share that hope that someday, somehow, God's promises will be made manifest in each one of us.

But with faith comes responsibility: we cannot believe and keep that belief to ourselves. The gift is for all, and it is our task to show that faith in God can make a difference in the lives of everyone we meet. This is the faith that drives evangelisation; by telling our story we inspire others to want to know more about this God of ours. The Gospel passage reminds us of another aspect of this responsibility. Jesus tells the disciples a parable about the kingdom of heaven. He speaks of a welcoming God who has prepared a place for those who believe in Him. With this gift there is also a warning; we cannot expect to claim our place in heaven if our time on earth is wasted on things that cannot last. If we set our hearts on heaven, then we must live a life that will achieve our heart's desire.


