Inspired by the life and work of renowned translator Anthea Bell, the prize aims to promote language learning and foster creativity within the classroom.

Building on Molly Davison's national success in 2024, this year sixth-form student Bridget Krancioch-Daniel received a commendation for her entry in the North East region. Her translation of an extract from L'Incendie by Mohammed Dib (1954) was successful in its preservation of the stylistic nuances of the original text and notable for her creative solutions to address untranslatable elements.
