## A message from Mr M Doyle (Assistant Headteacher)

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the halfway point of the academic year at English Martyrs, I wanted to take this opportunity to reflect on the fantastic progress our students have made so far and to update you on the important events taking place in the months ahead. I also wanted to express my gratitude for the warm welcome extended by our students, parents and carers since joining the team in September; it really has been a privilege to become part of this community.

My role is to identify strategies and academic interventions that help every learner reach their full potential, ensuring all students leave English Martyrs with strong qualifications. Each week, Mr G Thompson (Head of School), Mr C Cocoran (Deputy Headteacher) and I meet with Curriculum Leaders to discuss every Year 11 student individually, ensuring our support is sharply focused on achievement. I have been hugely impressed by the dedication and passion of our Curriculum Leaders, who work tirelessly to provide the highest quality education.

The EMS Period 6 timetable has quickly become a cornerstone of our Year 11 support. It has been inspiring to see so many students commit to these after-school sessions and to watch the cohort grow increasingly ambitious. Regular attendance has already proved invaluable in helping students work towards their best possible grades.

Last week, motivational speaker Cameron Parker encouraged Year 11 to attend as many Period 6 sessions as possible to achieve their "World Cup dreams", further strengthening the culture of aspiration within the year group. I am delighted to report that, thanks to strong engagement with our support package and continued refinement of high-quality teaching, outcomes in the English and Maths winter mock exams improved by over 10% compared with last year's cohort.

We warmly invite all parents, carers and students to our Year 11 Revision Information Evening on Tuesday 3rd February, 4:00–6:00pm. Subject representatives will be available to offer practical guidance on supporting your child through the final stages of their GCSEs, and we will be distributing the Year 11 Revision Packages. The evening will provide clear strategies to help students prepare effectively and achieve — or exceed — their target grades.

Last week, I also delivered assemblies on the Catholic virtue of self-belief, encouraging students to recognise and use their God-given gifts in service of others. As part of this, we are supporting CAFOD, our chosen charity. In 12 weeks, I will be running the London Marathon for English Martyrs and Team CAFOD, launching a series of initiatives to promote students' physical, mental and spiritual development. Training is well underway, and I hope to complete the 26.2 miles in one piece!

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## Holocaust Memorial Day

This week, our school community came together for a deeply moving Celebration of the Word to mark Holocaust Memorial Day, held on Tuesday 27th January 2026. This annual act of remembrance invites us to reflect on the six million Jewish people who were murdered during the Holocaust, alongside Roma and Sinti communities, disabled people, political opponents, Jehovah's Witnesses, gay people, and many others persecuted under the Nazi regime. We also remembered those who suffered in subsequent genocides, including Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

The theme for this year, Bridging Generations, guided our reflection. Students learned that as survivors grow fewer, the responsibility of remembrance passes to us to listen to their stories, to carry them forward, and to ensure that the lessons of the past inspire a more compassionate future. The theme encouraged students to see remembrance not only as an act of memory but as a bridge between history and hope, calling us to shape a world where such suffering is never repeated.

During the liturgy, students from across the school reverently led Scripture readings from Deuteronomy, Isaiah, St Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, the Psalms, and the Gospel of Matthew. These readings offered powerful messages about unity, courage, dignity, and the call to bring light into darkness. Together, they helped our school community reflect on the importance of standing against prejudice, discrimination, and hatred in all its forms.

Our pupils also led us in prayer, remembering all victims of genocide and praying for unity among peoples, for courage to challenge hatred, and for peace across our world today. Moments of stillness invited the whole community to pause and honour those whose voices were silenced, while committing ourselves to being people who speak out for justice, compassion and human dignity.

As part of the national Light the Darkness initiative, families were invited to join people across the country at 8pm by lighting a candle and placing it in their window. This simple but powerful act serves as a symbol of solidarity, remembrance, and a shared commitment to standing against antisemitism and all forms of prejudice.

At English Martyrs, we believe every person is created in the image and likeness of God, and this truth guided our reflections throughout the service. Holocaust Memorial Day offers our school a moment not only to remember but also to act to recognise our shared responsibility in building a future shaped by compassion, justice and unity. Our students were encouraged to become bearers of light: young people who listen deeply, act justly, and carry the stories of the past into their daily choices, friendships and classrooms so that the horrors of genocide are neither forgotten nor repeated.

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## Geography Revision Weekend – March 2026

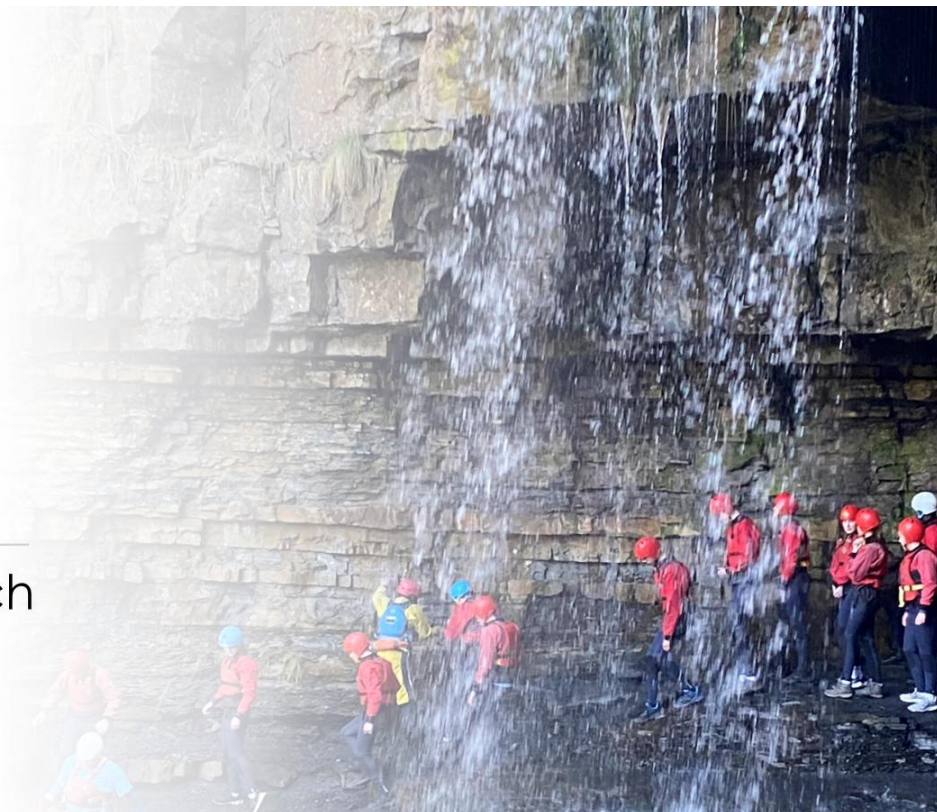

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## Theologian of the Week – A Level Religious Education

We are delighted to celebrate the achievements of our A Level Religious Education students through our Theologian of the Week award. The awards recognise students who demonstrate outstanding engagement, insight, and academic excellence in their theological studies, whether through exceptional contributions in class or high-quality independent work beyond the lesson.

For Year 12, the award is named after St Augustine, reflecting the curiosity, intellectual honesty, and depth of reflection that characterise both his thought and the early stages of advanced theological study. Students who receive the St Augustine Award show a willingness to question, explore, and develop their ideas with rigour and independence.

This week's St Augustine Theologian of the Week is Charlotte Boagey.

For Year 13, the award is named after St Thomas Aquinas, in recognition of sustained excellence, clarity of argument, and the confident application of theological, ethical and philosophical reasoning. Recipients of the St Thomas Aquinas Award exemplify mature scholarship and a deep engagement with complex ideas, preparing them well for examination success and further study.

This week's St Thomas Aquinas Theologian of the Week is Saffron Brown.

The Theologian of the Week award highlights our commitment to academic ambition and celebrates the rich tradition of theological thinking at the heart of A Level RE.
