Careers

Year 12 students have been informed about a number of university schemes. If they qualify and participate in a number of activities across the year, they could be eligible for reduced offers from a range of universities. Next Step York, Aim for Oxford, Pathways to Bath and Realising Opportunities - details have been shared with students on the Careers Teams. All universities have similar schemes - please encourage your son/daughter to research their choices.

<u>The Sutton Trust</u> run a series of programmes that are completely free to attend. From work experience to employability skill sessions to ongoing university and apprenticeship application support. Subjects include banking and finance, engineering, law, medicine, veterinary medicine.

Year 13 students are in the process of considering their next steps. Many are applying to university; some forms have been sent to UCAS and students have received offers. The final deadline for forms to be submitted is 14th January, however our internal deadline - Monday 3rd November. UCAS provides a wealth of information for parents and carers. For those considering the apprenticeship route Amazing Apprenticeships published the October 2025 edition of the higher and degree apprenticeship vacancies.






Musical Theatre
