Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of this 8-week half term, we can reflect on how far we have come as a school community in such a short space of time. You may be aware that internally the school gathers and tracks a wide range of data to monitor trends. This data helps inform our understanding of various aspects of school such as behaviour, attendance and academic progress. This information is then used to identify areas for improvement across the school but also to highlight areas that have improved due to our intervention.

I am delighted to report that following a review of the current set of data for this half term, we have seen record lows in negative behaviour and record highs in positive points achieved from students. These records go back approximately 5 years and confirms that our culture has seen significant improvements this half term.

Further to this, I am incredibly proud that our whole school attendance figures have moved above the secondary school average for Hartlepool. This is the first time in a number of years in which the school has seen such improvements. More students are attending English Martyrs, behaving well, accessing support and making progress in lessons. I want to thank parents and carers for supporting the school with our attendance drive. We know from data gathered that students who attend school 95% of the time or more, greatly improve their chances of succeeding when sitting their GCSEs.

We welcomed our Year 7 parents and carers to a 'Settling in' evening on Tuesday, which was very well attended. Parents met with their child's Tutor to ensure that each student's transition to secondary has been a positive experience and tutors further utilised the opportunity to make families aware of the pastoral support that was available for them at school. Evenings such as these are incredibly important in supporting our students and it provides an opportunity for open dialogue around a student's wellbeing, puts a face to the name and strengthens the relationship between staff, parents and students. Thank you also, to our wonderful Prefects who supported the evening, providing refreshments and collecting valuable feedback from parents.

Students have worked hard this half term, and I hope that all students have a well-deserved rest over the half term holidays. We look forward to welcoming our students back on Monday 3rd November.


Art - Year 8

We look forward to continuing our journey of faith together and supporting our students as they grow in their relationship with Christ.


