Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week, the government published the Final Report of its Curriculum and Assessment Review. This Report proposed revisions and recommendations to the National Curriculum, including changes to GCSEs, to come into effect from 2028. Although we are still digesting the full 197 pages, several key headlines stand out.

- Religious Education will become a National Curriculum Subject.
- A greater emphasis on the Arts and Performing Arts.
- English and Mathematics are central to student success.
- Strong transition from Primary to Secondary School is essential.

English Martyrs is already well placed to respond in these areas with our current curriculum model and I know that this is one of the many reasons parents and carers send their children to our school. We have strong specialist teachers in our Religious Education, Mathematics and English Departments and our transition programme led by Mr Gray and Mr Hutchinson is well established. Performing Arts and Visual Arts have a rich history at English Martyrs, and I am committed to continuing this tradition and enhancing opportunities in the future. At English Martyrs we understand how these opportunities enrich our students lives, and it is great to see their importance recognised nationally. Ms Stirk will have some exciting plans in the near future regarding this year's school production and details of the production will be revealed in the next few weeks.

On Tuesday 11th November, we celebrated Remembrance Day as a whole school community. Mr McCartie organised a wonderful event that was live streamed across the school. Joining the event we also had members of the public and local parishes, governors and ex-teachers from the school. Canon Paul led the remembrance prayers and many of our students dressed in regimental uniform. Our Head Boy and Girl devoted prayers to the fallen and a wonderful musical performance added to the significance of the occasion. The town of Hartlepool has a deeprooted history with the armed forces and English Martyrs as a community paused together, in silence, to pay our respects.

It can sometimes feel that the world we used to know is quickly changing, even in education with new Ofsted frameworks, curriculum reviews and policy shifts. The mission of English Martyrs remains steadfast, and we remain committed to delivering great education, high standards of conduct and meaningful partnerships with parents and carers.




### Year 13 Digital Media

### **Remembrance Day**
