Dear Parents and Carers,

As we enter the season of Advent which marks the start of the liturgical year, we are invited to prepare spiritually for Christmas through prayer, reflection, and acts of charity. Advent originally began as a season of preparation for Christmas and Epiphany. Its exact origins are uncertain, but by the 4th century it was observed in various forms, often with fasting and prayer, and by the 6th century it had become the four-week season we know today.

This week I have had the pleasure of leading Celebration of the Word each day with a different year group of students. We have discussed the significance of the Advent Wreath and the lighting of the Prophets candle or the candle of Hope. This is the first of the four candles to be lit. Each Sunday a new candle will be lit leading up to Christmas and our celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ, the long awaited and promised Messiah. As we journey through Advent, we are reminded that this is a season of hope—a time when we look forward with expectation to the coming of Christ at Christmas. Hope is not simply wishful thinking; it is a deep trust in God's promises and a light that guides us even in uncertain times. In school, we are encouraging the children to reflect on what hope means for them, and how they can share that hope with others.

As a school we are working hard on preparing the end of term celebrations for our students. On Thursday 11th December, we will be hosting our Christmas Jumper day and also our Christmas meal for all students. Each tutor group will have a special sitting in our dining hall that will be decorated differently to the usual day, to emphasise the special time of the year. Each of the tutor groups will have lunch as a community along with their form tutor to celebrate Christmas as a strong Catholic Community. The Senior Leadership Team will be on hand to serve the students meals to emphasise our togetherness and support that we have for each other. English Martyrs School want every student to enjoy this day, therefore all Christmas dinners for our students will be paid for by the school. If a student does not want the traditional Christmas dinner, alternatives will be available, again paid for by the school. We hope that this gesture shows our students that being a member of the English Martyrs community goes far beyond academic successes. This week at EMS we have decorated and blessed our school Christmas tree and placed our Advent Wreaths around the school building. Our school community is filled with anticipation, joy and hope for what the future holds.


#### **Year 13 Graphic Design**

We are pleased to announce that Sparx Maths is now available to all Year 11 students.

- Homework will be set every Wednesday and must be submitted by the following Tuesday.
- Students can access Sparx using their school email login.
- The more homework completed, the more Sparx will personalise each student's learning journey, helping them strengthen their understanding and achieve success.
- Research by the University of Cambridge shows that students who regularly engage with Sparx Maths achieve up to 67% more progress compared to those who do not.


The competition not only highlighted the artistic talent within KS3 but also fostered a sense of community and celebration as the school prepares for the holiday season.


