



This Sundays Readings

23rd Sunday of the Year

First reading:

Wisdom 9:13-18b

'Who can discern what the Lord wills?'

What human being can learn the counsel of God? Or who can discern what the Lord wills? For the reasoning of mortals is worthless, and our designs are likely to fail, for a perishable body weighs down the soul, and this earthy tent burdens the mind full of thoughts. We can hardly guess at what is on earth, and what is at hand we find with labour; but who has traced out what is in the heavens? Who has learned your counsel, unless you have given wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high? And thus the paths of those on earth were set right, and people were taught what pleases you.

Response: O Lord, you have been our refuge, from generation to generation.

Second Reading: Philemon 9b-10, 12-17

'Have him back no longer as a bondservant but as a beloved brother.'

Beloved: I, Paul, an old man and now a prisoner also for Christ Jesus — I appeal to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I became in my imprisonment. I am sending him back to you, sending my very heart. I would have been glad to keep him with me, in order that he might serve me on your behalf during my imprisonment for the gospel, but I preferred to do nothing without your consent in order that your goodness might not be by compulsion but of your own accord. For this perhaps is why he was parted from you for a while, that you might have him back for ever, no longer as a bondservant but more than a bondservant, as a beloved brother — especially to me, but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord. So if you consider me your partner, receive him as you would receive me.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia.

Let your face shine forth on your servant, and teach me your decrees Alleluia.

Gospel Reading: Luke 14:25-33

'Any one who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple.'

At that time: Great crowds accompanied Jesus, and he turned and said to them, 'If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother, and wife and children, and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, saying, "This man began to build and was not able to finish." Or what king, going out to encounter another king in war, will not sit down first and deliberate whether he is able with ten thousand to meet him who comes against him with twenty thousand? And if not, while the other is yet a great way off, he sends a delegation and asks for terms of peace. So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple.'

REFLECTION

We all live busy lives, often finding that we have to sacrifice one thing for another or one person needs to be put off while we give our time to someone else. We are faced, daily, with choices in the knowledge that, whatever choice we make someone will have to go without. Was life always like this or have we, in our 21st century lives, finally ran out of time?

There is a cost to the choices we make, and this is evident from the readings this Sunday. The choice today is: how do we serve God and each other? The first reading sets out the problem. We have a limited capacity to think, to understand, to know and to love. God, on the other hand, has an unlimited capacity for all those things. So how can we, as mortal human beings, serve a God who is all knowing, all powerful and all love. The answer comes at the end of the reading; we must seek the wisdom of God whose spirit will guide us in our choices. So, pray for God's wisdom and seek his guidance and, though it may come slowly, the wisdom of God will show you the way. Paul was touched by the wisdom of God. He suffered for his faith; he was scourged, left for dead and imprisoned because he laboured for God. Today he writes from prison to Philemon on behalf of a runaway slave called Onesimus. Though Onesimus is a great help to Paul, he sees it as his duty to Philemon to return him his slave. We are all slaves in our world today: we may not be in chains, but the demands of life leave us with very little spare time. Paul lets Onesimus go although he knows he will be sorely missed, what can you let go to give more time to serving Christ?

In the Gospel passage Jesus spells out very clearly the cost that may be demanded if we are to follow him. The loss of family was a very real threat to those who followed Christ. They risked everything for him because they believed in the kingdom he was preparing. The Gospel urges us to think carefully before we make any commitments, then, go ahead, with the wisdom you have gathered. Never underestimate the sacrifices you may have to take for Christ but always remember that the reward for your service is eternal life.


