Parishioners generously supported preparations for the day. Students worked with parishioners to arrange the stunning flower displays and collaborated to form a majestic choir and band. Student leaders facilitated tours and performed musical solos and ensembles throughout the day.

Former student and now Head of Computer Science, Bernadette Malcolmson, served for the 25th Anniversary of the school back in 1998 alongside Fr Shaun Purdy when both were in Year 9. "Today was a beautiful celebration and it was fantastic to see so many faces that have made such a significant impact on our community over the years" she told us. "Now, here in 2023, I reflect on having worked with 4 head teachers, 3 tutor groups, hundreds of fantastic students and shared in 2 significant anniversaries, proud to have played my part in giving just a little something back to the school that gave me so much as a child."

The school has been generously gifted a large crucifix that now hangs in the entrance to the School. Canon Paul Douthwaite and parishioners of St Cuthbert's, Hartlepool kindly donated the crucifix to the school to mark the school's 50th Anniversary. The beautiful cross has rich provenance and significance for the parish and is a treasured gift to the school.








ATTENDANCE WHEEL

SCHOOL APP

This year, we launched our new school app - MyChildAtSchool (MCAS). MyChildAtSchool is a portal enabling parents to view their child's academic performance in real-time. It allows exclusive access to the child's Attendance, Assessment and Behaviour whenever the parent/carer wishes. As well as student performance data, the portal also provides general useful information about school such as the Academic Calendar and Announcements.

Communication between home and school is vital, not just for teachers and parents but also for the student. Both parents and teachers can work together to provide a support system that helps children thrive and succeed in school.

When parents and teachers regularly share information about a child and what's happening in the classroom, it supports the learning process from all sides, setting up students for success.

The student would benefit from improved academic achievement, regular attendance, a positive attitude towards learning, a feeling of confidence and enhanced relationships.
