We'll start this newsletter where we left off from the last academic year and start by celebrating the excellent achievements of the Year 11 and 13 students who collected results in the summer.


GCSE Results

Congratulations to the Year 11 Rugby team who kicked off the season with 2 wins and a draw at a 10's tournament at Allen's West.






We awarded our new House and Sports Captains with their badges in an assembly. The role of this leadership group is to help around the school with Events, House Competitions, Student Council and much more.



Enjoy this wonderful performance from Year 12 student Ava and her haunting performance of the theme from Schindler's List. Simply beautiful.



A 3-1 win over South Hunsley (East Riding) saw our Year 10 footballers progress to the next round of the ESFA National Cup. Brilliant!





Students and staff from The English Martyrs School and Sixth Form College are celebrating the success of their latest musical performance of 'Oliver!'.

Oliver, played by Year 7 student, Tilly Duffield, is a timeless classic based on the Charles Dickens novel Oliver Twist about a young orphan boy who dared to ask for more.

Performed to nearly eight hundred spectators over a three-night run at Hartlepool Town Hall Theatre, the cast and crew put on a production that left audiences full of praise for the young talent on show with many messages of support being left on the school's social media channels.

The annual musical at English Martyrs is a long-served tradition of the school and thousands of students have trodden the boards in various musicals across the past fifty years.

Musical Director and Choreographer, Mrs Charlotte Stirk said: "Oliver is an all-time classic musical packed with great songs."

"The cast worked unbelievably hard, rehearsing at least three times a week to be ready for the performances and I couldn't be prouder of them all."







Since the move to their new building in September 2019, the school made the decision to move their musical to a professional theatre.

Mr Steve Hope, a long-time servant of the show said: "Giving the students the opportunity to perform in a professional theatre is fantastic."

"It allows us to have a larger cast which opens up the door for more students to be involved in the production."

Oliver! is the first production from EMS since the success of Sister Act in February 2020, a week before the pandemic, which meant this was the first musical for a large number of the cast.

Mrs Sara Crawshaw, Headteacher at the large secondary school and sixth form college, said: "This was my first experience of the musicals at EMS and it was far beyond all expectations"

"It gave me such pride to see all the students performing together and seeing our younger students learning from the experience of our Sixth Form students."

"To create a show of that standard in just 8 weeks is incredible and I thank everyone who was involved in making our production a such a huge success."

The Artsmark Award is the only creative quality standard for schools, accredited by Arts Council England. It supports schools to develop and celebrate arts and cultural education, putting creativity and well-being at the heart of the curriculum. Artsmark ensures every young person can be creative and access a diverse, high-quality cultural education.

In order to achieve their Gold Artsmark Award, the large secondary school and sixth form college had to develop their arts and culture provision to embed a broad and ambitious curriculum. This was achieved by creating an overall plan that was committed to and delivered across the whole school.


EMS was supported by Tyne & Wear Archives and Museums (Culture Bridge North East) – North East in planning and developing their objectives. Culture Bridge worked alongside the school at various stages to support their Gold Artsmark Award achievement.

The Artsmark assessor commended the school on its: "long-term commitment to arts and culture which is beginning to have measurable effects on staff and pupils. All pupils can access a diverse and consistent range of arts and cultural provision through work with local arts and cultural organisations, both in school and on visits outside the classroom, which leads to showcasing in school and the local community."

On receiving the award, Headteacher Mrs Sara Crawshaw said: "We're extremely proud of achieving our Artsmark Gold Award. We are committed to delivering a high-quality arts and cultural education and we look forward to continue to develop our offer."

Arts Governor Matthew Hutchinson said: "Congratulations to all staff and students who have embraced the legacy of arts at EMS and are continuing to maintain ambition for the arts and our commitment to our local area".






