First Reading: Acts 1:15-17,20-26

'Let someone else take his office'

One day Peter stood up to speak to the brothers – there were about a hundred and twenty persons in the congregation: 'Brothers, the passage of scripture had to be fulfilled in which the Holy Spirit, speaking through David, foretells the fate of Judas, who offered himself as a guide to the men who arrested Jesus – after having been one of our number and actually sharing this ministry of ours. Now in the Book of Psalms it says:

Let someone else take his office.

'We must therefore choose someone who has been with us the whole time that the Lord Jesus was travelling round with us, someone who was with us right from the time when John was baptising until the day when he was taken up from us — and he can act with us as a witness to his resurrection.'

Having nominated two candidates, Joseph known as Barsabbas, whose surname was Justus, and Matthias, they prayed, 'Lord, you can read everyone's heart; show us therefore which of these two you have chosen to take over this ministry and apostolate, which Judas abandoned to go to his proper place.' They then drew lots for them, and as the lot fell to Matthias, he was listed as one of the twelve apostles.

Response: The Lord has set his sway in heaven.

Second Reading: 1 John 4:11-16

Anyone who lives in love lives in God, and God lives in him

My dear people, since God has loved us so much, we too should love one another. No one has ever seen God; but as long as we love one another God will live in us and his love will be complete in us. We can know that we are living in him and he is living in us because he lets us share his Spirit. We ourselves saw and we testify that the Father sent his Son as saviour of the world. If anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God lives in him, and he in God. We ourselves have known and put our faith in God's love towards ourselves. God is love and anyone who lives in love lives in God, and God lives in him.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! I will not leave you orphans, says the Lord; I will come back to you, and your hearts will be full of joy. Alleluia!

Gospel Reading John 17:11-19

Father, keep those you have given me true to your name

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said: 'Holy Father, keep those you have given me true to your name, so that they may be one like us. While I was with them, I kept those you had given me true to your name. I have watched over them and not one is lost except the one who chose to be lost, and this was to fulfil the scriptures. But now I am coming to you and while still in the world I say these things to share my joy with them to the full. I passed your word on to them, and the world hated them, because they belong to the world no more than I belong to the world. I am not asking you to remove them from the world, but to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. Consecrate them in the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world, and for their sake I consecrate myself so that they too may be consecrated in truth.'

REFLECTION

Ordinary people are capable of extraordinary achievements; when we read through the Book of Acts and come to know the individual members of the first Christian communities we stand in awe at their accomplishments. How did this group of individuals find the strength and the courage to stand up in the face of the Jewish and eventually the Roman authorities and show their faith in a crucified Christ? There is no simple answer; but, as we listen to the Easter readings there emerges a story of faith built on the bedrock of scripture and teaching and nourished by the love of God. We cannot fail to be lost in wonder as we walk with the early church through these Easter days.

Sometimes those raised to authority are found to be unworthy. The apostles must have spent a great deal of time discussing the events of Good Friday and the actions of Judas, one of their own. None of them emerged from the events of that day with any credit; they failed Our Lord in so many ways. They must have seen themselves, perhaps, in the image of Judas. The decision to replace him was a simple one. Jesus had called the twelve and now they must replace the one that was lost. Matthias appears only briefly in the scriptures. Today's reading tells us he was with Jesus throughout His ministry and must have been one of the disciples who followed him. Each of the apostles were called because of what they might become. We can see the hand of the Holy Spirit working through the choice of Mathias; that same Spirit continues to help us to discern those who are placed in leadership roles in our church today.

Leadership is a fundamental need in our church. We have always been blessed by men and women prepared to lead our communities through the storms of our turbulent world. Many of the decisions taken in our church are at an individual level, each question has a pastoral significance and, to be truly the Church of Christ, we must seek to answer each question in a personal, compassionate, and loving way. When we listen to the Gospel and the letters of John we are continually reminded that the love of God is at the centre of all human endeavour. Jesus asks that those who he has chosen be kept safe from the evil one, and that they be consecrated in the truth. Let us pray that all who lead, from our Pope Francis, through our Bishops and priests, down to the humblest chair of the smallest committee in our church, be filled with the joy and love of God.

Today let us celebrate Jesus returning to the Father in Heaven, and remember that we hope to join them some day!


