SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION - Bishop Stephen will join us to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation on 27th November at 6.30pm in St Joseph's Church. Please come along to support the young people of our parish and welcome the Bishop.

ALTAR SERVERS - Servers from all of the churches of our parish are welcome to serve at the Mass of Confirmation on Wednesday 27th November. If you intend to do so, could you arrive no later than 6pm so that there can be a short practice before the Mass.

JUBILEE 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE - Pope Francis has announced that next years Jubilee will have the theme Pilgrims of Hope. Similar to the last Holy year, he has also enabled Bishops throughout the world to open Holy Doors in their own dioceses so that all of the faithful can participate. Bishop Stephen has asked our parish to welcome pilgrims during this Year of Jubilee and that a Holy Door be opened at St Joseph's Church.

Further to our meeting in which we discussed the practicalities as a parish of hosting the Holy Door, we have established a team of volunteers for each day who will be able to act as welcomers. The welcomers will open the church, prepare for Mass and simply be a presence in the church whilst it is open. There is still need for further volunteers to join the teams, if you are able to help with this, please contact Laura in the office. In addition to our own volunteers, Bishop Stephen has requested for priests and laity from around the diocese to support us in welcoming pilgrims. Initially it is thought that the Holy Door will be open every day, Monday to Friday 11am-2.30pm, Saturday 1pm-5pm, and Sunday 9.30am-Noon.

First Reading: Daniel 12:1-3

Some will wake to everlasting life, some to shame and disgrace

'At that time Michael will stand up, the great prince who mounts guard over your people. There is going to be a time of great distress, unparalleled since nations first came into existence. When that time comes, your own people will be spared, all those whose names are found written in the Book. Of those who lie sleeping in the dust of the earth many will awake, some to everlasting life, some to shame and everlasting disgrace. The learned will shine as brightly as the vault of heaven, and those who have instructed many in virtue, as bright as stars for all eternity.'

Response: Preserve me, God, I take refuge in you.

Second Reading: Hebrews 10:11-14,18

When all sins have been forgiven, there can be no more sin-offerings

All the priests stand at their duties every day, offering over and over again the same sacrifices which are quite incapable of taking sins away. He, on the other hand, has offered one single sacrifice for sins, and then taken his place forever, at the right hand of God, where he is now waiting until his enemies are made into a footstool for him. By virtue of that one single offering, he has achieved the eternal perfection of all whom he is sanctifying. When all sins have been forgiven, there can be no more sin offerings.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! Stay awake and stand ready, because you do not know the hour when the Son of Man is coming. Alleluia!

Gospel Reading Mark 13:24-32

The stars will fall from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven.

'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.'

REFLECTION

As we near the end of the Church's vear the theme of the scripture passages changes and the vision of the "end times" comes into focus. We are now moving into the depths of winter, the nights are darker, the weather unpredictable and, in nature, death and decay are all around us. It is very difficult to see any promise of hope in the world in which we live. Yet we are a people of hope; a people who are at their best when times are tough, and we are beset by problems and challenges. It is a sign of hope that from the ruins of the closing year we can see a way forward to a brighter future and the symbol of that hope is the coming season of Advent.

The readings appear to be, on first sight, as gloomy as the weather; Daniel has the Archangel Michael coming to us in a time of great distress, the Gospel speaks of darkness and of stars falling from the sky. However, if we look beyond the fear, we can just glimpse the light of a new spring in our lives. Michael stands up; the great warrior angel comes to our aid. It is he who will be our guard and protector through the period of darkness and uncertainty. All

those whose names are written in the Book will be spared, the righteous, the believers, the ones who show love and compassion, they will be numbered in the saved. Many of those who have died will come to eternal life; we will shine brightly as the stars in heaven, this is not a story of despair but bright shining hope.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus echoes that theme of hope and of new life. He warns us that times may be hard, that life will throw its challenges at us. but we know that, if we are faithful to Him, we will not come to harm. He speaks of sending his angels to gather his people from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven. He uses the symbol of the Fig Tree to remind us that new life blossoms on the tree when summer is approaching; that hope in the future is not false, that the pain and suffering of this world will pass away to be replaced by a new heaven and a new earth.

As long as we stay close to God and keep away from sin, we can be happy when the end


