ALTAR SERVERS MASS - Traditionally, a Mass is celebrated around the Feast of St Stephen, the Patron Saint of Altar Servers. We will have an Altar Servers Mass on Friday 27th December at 12.05pm at St Joseph's Church. This will be a celebration for all of the servers of the parish, an opportunity to invest new servers into the Guild of Saint Stephen and to thank our servers for their faithful service at the altar. Please do join us for this celebration.

JUBILEE 2025 - Pope Francis has announced that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, and the theme is "Pilgrims of Hope". It will be a year of pilgrimage and prayer, celebration and reconciliation and we'll be opening the Jubilee Year in our Diocese with celebrations at our 2 Jubilee Hub Churches on Sunday 29th December. Bishop Stephen will be celebrating Mass and opening the Holy Door at St Mary's Cathedral, Newcastle at 11.30am and at St Joseph's Hartlepool at 4.00pm. Everyone is welcome. In addition to our own volunteers, Bishop Stephen has requested for priests and laity from around the diocese to support us in welcoming pilgrims. Initially it is thought that the Holy Door will be open every day, Monday to Friday 11am-2.30pm, Saturday 1pm-5pm, and Sunday 9.30am-Noon.

This Sundays Readings

4th Sunday of Advent

First Reading:

Micah 5:2-5a

'From you shall come forth one who is to be ruler in Israel.'

Thus says the Lord:

You, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days.

Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labour has given birth; then the rest of his brothers shall return to the people of Israel.

And he shall stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the Lord,

in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God.

And they shall dwell secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth. And he shall be their peace.

Response: Bring us back, O God; let your face shine forth, and we shall be saved.

Second Reading: Hebrews 10:5-10

'Behold, I have come to do your will.'

Brothers and sisters: When Christ came into the world, he said, 'Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body have you prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. Then I said, "Behold, I have come to do your will, O God, as it is written of me in the scroll of the book."

When he said above, 'You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings' (these are offered according to the Law), then he added, 'Behold, I have come to do your will'. He does away with the first in order to establish the second. And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Alleluia, alleluia! Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word. Alleluia!

Luke 1:39-45

'Why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me?'

In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, and she exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! And why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For behold, when the sound of your greeting came to my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her from the Lord.'

order, Jesus is coming and the whole joyous occasion is almost upon us. If there are last minute worries, put them behind you, now is the time, relax and enjoy. We begin with the prophet Micah, speaking of the insignificant town of Bethlehem, "From you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel". Micah sees Christ, not as a

mighty king, but, as a shepherd standing and feeding his flock so that they may live secure. He reminds us of the promise of God for the Christ Child "He shall be their peace".

The psalm is a plea for forgiveness and protection and gives us hope that the hand of God will always be with us. "Let your face shine forth, and we shall be saved"

The passage from Hebrews brings a different dimension to the coming birth. It speaks of sacrifice and obedience, In the midst of birth we have a foretaste of the garden of Gethsemane and Jesus praying to the father "Here I am, I am coming to do your will"

The meeting of Mary and Elizabeth is both poignant and heartwarming, one approach to this reading is to sit quietly, if you can find a space in the turmoil, and pray the "Hail Mary". a prayer rich in scripture and insight. Pope John Paul II suggested that when we say this prayer we pause before and after the name "Jesus" because the prayer is said through Our Lady to Jesus and by pausing, we offer the prayer in a very special way.

Each Christmas we dream of a new start. each New Year we see twelve months, fresh and clean, laid out before us, an empty sea waiting for our boat of dreams to set sail. But if we only dream and not turn those dreams into action then our boat will stav in harbour and never feel the wind filling its sails. Marv's "Yes" to Gabriel set her dreams free, John the Baptists "yes" to a mission of bringing repentance to the people of Israel set him free. Jesus waits for our "yes" so that he can set us free on the path he has prepared for us. So, listen for his call, then, raise your anchor and set your sails. The ride will not be smooth, but the wind of your dreams will take you on a voyage you will never forget.
