PARISH OFFICE - will be closed on Good Friday and Easter Monday. Bulletins for next week to be collected on Thursday.



This Sundays Readings

PALM SUNDAY

Gospel Reading

Mark 11:1-10

Blessings on him who comes in the name of the Lord.

When they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, and said to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat; untie it and bring it. If any one says to you, "Why are you doing this?" say, "The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately." And they went away, and found a colt tied at the door out in the open street; and they untied it. And those who stood there said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' And they told them what Jesus had said; and they let them go. And they brought the colt to Jesus, and threw their garments on it; and he sat upon it. And many spread their garments on the road, and others spread leafy branches which they had cut from the fields. And those who went before and those who followed cried out, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is coming! Hosanna in the highest!'

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

I did not cover my face against insult: I know I shall not be shamed

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away.

I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

Response: My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Christ humbled himself but God raised him high

His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Gospel Acclamation:

Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory! Christ was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all names. Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory!

REFLECTION

Son of Man, Word made flesh, came down from above.

Taught us faith, taught us truth, gave us hope and love.

But our sin fell on him, He was born to die, We scomed His words, turned our backs, ignored his anguished cry.

Just a man, just a man, just like you and I. So we nailed him to a tree, left Him there to die.

Left him there to die.

Lamb of God, Lord of all, how can you forgive?

Take us to your heart again, teach us how to live.

Is your love strong enough, can it conquer all, Can it teach this foolish heart to listen when you call.

Just a man, just a man, just like you and I, He died for us but rose again. Never more to die.

Now He reigns on high.

This piece was written many years ago but, as with the whole message of Passion Sunday, it contains an unquestionable truth. Jesus died for each and every one of us so that we may live, not in our light, but in His light. Let us take this Holy Week journey and set out to change our lives so that we may serve the God of Love in the way that leads to a better world.




