JUBILEE 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE - Pope Francis has announced that next years Jubilee will have the theme Pilgrims of Hope. Similar to the last Holy year, he has also enabled Bishops throughout the world to open Holy Doors in their own dioceses so that all of the faithful can participate. Bishop Stephen has asked our parish to welcome pilgrims during this Year of Jubilee and that a Holy Door be opened at St Joseph's Church.

Further to our meeting in which we discussed the practicalities as a parish of hosting the Holy Door, we have established a team of volunteers for each day who will be able to act as welcomers. The welcomers will open the church, prepare for Mass and simply be a presence in the church whilst it is open. There is still need for further volunteers to join the teams, if you are able to help with this, please contact Laura in the office. In addition to our own volunteers, Bishop Stephen has requested for priests and laity from around the diocese to support us in welcoming pilgrims. Initially it is thought that the Holy Door will be open every day, Monday to Friday 11am-2.30pm, Saturday 1pm-5pm, and Sunday 9.30am-Noon.

Gospel Reading John 18:33-37

Yes, I am a king

'Are you the king of the Jews?' Pilate asked. Jesus replied, 'Do you ask this of your own accord, or have others spoken to you about me?' Pilate answered, 'Am I a Jew? It is your own people and the chief priests who have handed you over to me: what have you done?' Jesus replied, 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world; if my kingdom were of this world, my men would have fought to prevent my being surrendered to the Jews. But my kingdom is not of this kind.' 'So you are a king then?' said Pilate. 'It is you who say it' answered Jesus. 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.'

REFLECTION

"Who do people say I am?" This question about the identity of Jesus runs as an undercurrent throughout the Gospels. If the Gospel were a book of fiction, a "who done it", you may have puzzled over the identity of Jesus throughout the book and, even at the climax, you would still be struggling for an answer. It is as if Jesus is challenging us every step of the way to try and identify him, to believe in him, to follow him.

"Are you the King of the Jews?" Pilate is struggling with the identity of Jesus. He senses there is more to this man than he has been told. His wife has begged him "Have nothing to do with this man" but Pilate is intrigued; he senses something about this man, but he cannot explain what. Pilate is a man of authority and power, yet he treats Jesus as an equal. Jesus is a Jew, condemned by his own people as a blasphemer and one who deserves to die; he is not a man to attract the attention of the leader of Roman rule in a small Middle East province, yet he stands before him and debates with him.

"Yes, I am a King"; Jesus reveals His identity; He is King, but not of this world. The Kingdom of Jesus is far greater than the Roman Empire; He is the King who reigns in human hearts, the King of Love. Jesus then reveals His purpose to Pilate. He has chosen death so that all might live. For this He was born of the Virgin Mary. He has come so that truth may be seen and all who believe in Him will be witnesses to the truth that He is the Son of God.

Today's readings, on this the last Sunday of the Year, fill us with hope in the Risen Christ. He is the son of man described in the vision of Daniel, but He is also the Son of God from the Book of the Apocalypse, the one who, by His death and resurrection, has purchased for us eternal life. The answer to the question "Who do people say I am?" is answered in the Book of the Apocalypse.; "Jesus Christ is the faithful witness, the First Born from the dead, the Ruler of the kings of the earth; the one who loves us and who has washed away our sins with his blood and made us a line of kings, priests to serve his God and Father."

Jesus is a good king who loves His people so much that He died so we could go to Heaven.


