Second Reading: Hebrews 5:1-6

'You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever'

Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; and so he can sympathise with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too lives in the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by God, as Aaron was. Nor did Christ give himself the glory of becoming high priest, but he had it from the one who said to him: You are my son, today I have become your father, and in another text: You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever.

Gospel Reading Mark 10:46-52

Go; your faith has saved you

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.

REFLECTION

'No one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by God'

The Book of Hebrews was written for Christians of the first century when those Jews who followed the teaching of Jesus were beginning to emerge from Judaism. The author is unknown; it is written from a Jewish perspective, but gives us, today, an insight into that religion and it's touching points with our beliefs. We cannot completely associate our notion of priesthood with that of the high priest of Judaism; theirs was an inherited position, but the principles of priesthood as mentioned in today's passage help to link our priesthood with that of the order of Melchizedek, a link that goes back to the very beginning of humanities worship of the one true God.

All priests have responded to a call to vocation inspired by the Holy Spirit: this is not a call to be taken lightly, it is a very demanding call to sacrifice one's own needs for those of the community that one serves. Just consider that first line "taken out of mankind and appointed to act for men in their relations with God". Priests are not supermen; they have the same hopes, dreams, fears and joys that we share. They devote their lives to serving others and this brings them into contact with all levels of society; we may turn away from certain situations, a priest cannot. He must face whatever his ministry leads him to; it is no small wonder that some hesitate, some turn away from this awesome duty.

The Gospel passage reveals to us the power that enables a man to come to the priesthood; the story is of the blind man, Bartimaeus, and his faith in Jesus. This faith gives the man courage to ask for a cure for his blindness and that same faith gives him back his sight. The man who chooses to test his vocation by volunteering for the priesthood is like Bartimaeus, he cannot see where his vocation will take him, but he hopes that his faith will be sufficient to bring him through the years of training to ordination, and that same faith will stand by him through the long years that lie ahead. In our Baptism we are called to be priests; not as an ordained man but, all of us men and women, as servants to our families and neighbours. Let us pray that we too may have the courage to see our way to follow Christ down the road.

Sometimes we can be blind too. When we don't see the truth about God, or when we can't see our own faults then we have a kind of blindness.


When we find that we can't see ourselves or God clearly, we should be like Bartimaeus and call out to Jesus to help us. If we believe in Him then we will get our sight back too.
