REFLECTION

First Reading: Acts 9:26-31

Barnabas explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul on his journey

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

Response: You, Lord, are my praise in the great assembly.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:18-24

The commandment of faith and love

My children, our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active; only by this can we be certain that we are children of the truth and be able to quieten our conscience in his presence, whatever accusations it may raise against us, because God is greater than our conscience and he knows everything.

My dear people, if we cannot be condemned by our own conscience, we need not be afraid in God's presence, and whatever we ask him, we shall receive, because we keep his commandments and live the kind of life that he wants.

His commandments are these: that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another as he told us to.

Whoever keeps his commandments lives in God and God lives in him. We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. Whoever remains in me bears fruit in plenty. Alleluia!

Gospel Reading

John 15:1-8

I am the vine, you are the branches

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more.

You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me.

I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing.

Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away – he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'

I enjoy gardening, it brings me close to nature and naturally to God. I often think of God as a gardener, sorting through His people, His seeds, deciding what to grow and then sowing, caring for the seedlings, and eventually planting them in the garden and watching for the results.

Saul, now back in Jerusalem, was a great orator; he spoke out boldly, proclaiming the Good News to anyone who would listen, so much so that he stirred up a hornet's nest of argument and opposition among his listeners. This caused a problem for the followers of Jesus who were, at last, living in an uneasy peace, with their neighbours. Eventually he was sent to Tarsus for his own safety and that of the community. When pruning and caring for a vine it is sometimes better to leave the vine in peace so it can grow and begin to produce fruit.

John's letter speaks to us about love and urges us to make it "real and active, not just "words or mere talk". Sometimes the word "love" is used casually, without thought, and this can lead to misunderstandings. Love is truthful. and should be spoken about with respect for the power of the meaning of the word. John continues his letter with some wise words about our conscience'. There is something within us that knows the difference between Good and Evil. If we follow the Word of the Father, then we should act in goodness in all our activities. In this way our love is shown to be true to the Spirit of God living within us.

The true vine is the teaching of Christ guiding our way through life. If we follow him, we can allow ourselves to be pruned by his love so that we can bear fruit in plenty to build his kingdom. If we turn away from him then we cut ourselves away from the vine and our life will be wasted. Because of the amount of work that is falling on the shoulders of our priests and religious there is a great need today for the Laity to use their gifts and talents in the church. Each of us should look bevond our own needs and see and seize the opportunities that are available to work at grass roots in our parishes. The vineyard will only survive if each branch is fruitful and ready to bear fruit, without the work of human hands, and God's caring love, we can do nothina.

Kids Corper: Jesus is the True Vine


Jesus says that He is the vine and we are the branches. Branches grow out from a vine and receive their food from the main stem. They grow leaves and bear fruit.

Our souls get their life from Jesus. When we stay united with Him then our souls are healthy and able to do good works, like the grapes that grow on a healthy vine.



Doing a serious sin is like cutting oneself off of the main vine. The nutrition can't flow into the branch because it's cut off! The branch can't grow leaves or fruit and it withers and dries up. Even though you can't see it, that is what happens to a soul that doesn't have God's life coming into it.

Sometimes a branch of a vine needs to be pruned. A bit gets cut off, but then it grows even better where it was cut. In the same way, sometimes God lets us suffer, but then our souls can grow even stronger and bear more good fruit. Next time you are
