JUBILEE 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE - Pope Francis has announced that next years Jubilee will have the theme Pilgrims of Hope. Similar to the last Holy year, he has also enabled Bishops throughout the world to open Holy Doors in their own dioceses so that all of the faithful can participate. Bishop Stephen has asked our parish to welcome pilgrims during this Year of Jubilee and that a Holy Door be opened at St Joseph's Church. A meeting will take place on Monday 28th October, after 6.30pm Mass (7pm) in the Parish Centre Hall at St Joseph's for anyone interested in assisting practically around the Church during the Holy Year.

LITURGY DAYS FOR READERS - The Diocesan Liturgical Formation team are running a day for readers of all levels of experience to explore the new translation of the Lectionary on Saturday 9 November at St Augustine, Darlington, DL3 7RG. This day will provide an opportunity to look at the background of the new Lectionary and to be ready to proclaim the Scriptures. The cost is £15. FLAME 2025 - Flame 2025 takes place on Saturday 15th March. The theme is 'UNSTOPPABLE. FAN THE FLAME OF HOPE'. It is open to anyone from school year 9 to University/young adult age. Under 18s must be part of an organised group. Two years ago, over 700 young people from our Diocese travelled to Wembley Arena for this national Catholic youth gathering. Once again YMT is hoping to take a large number of young people (up to 1,000 including accompanying adults). COST: £45 per person (includes return rail travel, Wembley ticket and London travel card). First Reading: Numbers 11:25-29

If only the whole people of the Lord were prophets!

The Lord came down in the Cloud. He spoke with Moses, but took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. When the spirit came on them they prophesied, but not again.

Two men had stayed back in the camp; one was called Eldad and the other Medad. The spirit came down on them; though they had not gone to the Tent, their names were enrolled among the rest. These began to prophesy in the camp. The young man ran to tell this to Moses, 'Look,' he said 'Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.' Then said Joshua the son of Nun, who had served Moses from his youth, 'My Lord Moses, stop them!' Moses answered him, 'Are you jealous on my account? If only the whole people of the Lord were prophets, and the Lord gave his Spirit to them all!'

Response: The precepts of the Lord gladden the heart.

Second Reading: James 5:1-6

The Lord hears the cries of those you have cheated

An answer for the rich. Start crying, weep for the miseries that are coming to you. Your wealth is all rotting, your clothes are all eaten up by moths. All your gold and your silver are corroding away, and the same corrosion will be your own sentence, and eat into your body. It was a burning fire that you stored up as your treasure for the last days. Labourers mowed your fields, and you cheated them – listen to the wages that you kept back, calling out; realise that the cries of the reapers have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. On earth you have had a life of comfort and luxury; in the time of slaughter you went on eating to your heart's content. It was you who condemned the innocent and killed them; they offered you no resistance.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! Your word is truth, O Lord: consecrate us in the truth. Alleluia!

Gospel Reading Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48

Do not stop anyone from working a miracle in my name

John said to Jesus, 'Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name; and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him.' But Jesus said, 'You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us.

'If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.

'But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out.'

REFLECTION

Sometimes, when you are in need, help often comes from unexpected places. The compassion that exists in every human heart comes to the surface when people are in trouble, and it is usually strangers who respond in your hour of need. A fall in the street, a puncture on a wet dark night, a helping hand with the shopping, there often is someone there for you when these unexpected events occur, and the helper is usually someone who you do not know or who you would not normally associate with. People see a need and respond; today's readings remind us that the human heart sees no barriers and that goodness can exist in everybody.

We belong to an open and inclusive church but there are times when prejudice and misunderstanding can create barriers. Sometimes gifted people can be excluded from an activity because they do not belong in a particular group. Medad and Eldad represent those who work for God but from a different viewpoint from the "chosen" helpers of Moses. The gift they are given is essentially of the Spirit and must be respected by all. There are many in our world who work for Christ but outside the normal areas of established religion.

The final extract from the Letter of Saint James is a very dire warning to those who are rich and do not share their wealth with those in need. It has been refreshing to listen to the words of the brother of Our Lord over the last few weeks. He lived in a very unequal world where the rich were few and the needy many and he is a constant reminder to us that, though we may be privileged to live in a very modern, sophisticated world, we too are still part of the richest 5% of the world's population and this message may well apply to us!

The Gospel message is very stark and severe; today is not a day for the fainthearted. Jesus is repeating the message of Moses; "Anyone who is not against us is for us"; and reminds us of the rewards that await those who follow Him. There is also a warning here for those who fail in their responsibility for their children. The concept of the domestic church is that the parents are the first teachers of their children and that if we fail in this task then God will hold us responsible for that failure. However, we, as parents, can only try to inspire faith and the choice to follow Christ depends on every individual making their own, mature choice.

We should try to talk to our Guardian Angel every day. Thank your angel for looking after you, and ask him to keep protecting you from evil. Here is a good prayer you can say every day:


