

To facilitate this, I together with others, offer an initial Diocesan vision for your prayerful reflection. Our discerned Diocesan commitments are: To Walk with Jesus and Enable Others to Encounter Him; To grow as One Diocesan Family-Rebuilding Relationships; Forming and Developing People for Mission; Living Justly and Caring for Our Common Home. Each of these commitments are developed in the vision. It is not my intention to impose this vision. It is offered for further reflection and I invite all of our parishes and communities to prayerfully reflect on them. To support the delivery of this vision there will be local training available. If you are interested in this please speak with Canon Paul. A copy of the vision is displayed at the back of each church.

First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8

#### This is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

Response: The cup of salvation I will raise; I will call on the Lord's name.

**Second Reading:** Hebrews 9:11-15

#### The blood of Christ can purify our inner self

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than the one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

#### **Gospel Reading** Mark 14:12-16,22-26

#### This is my body; this is my blood

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.'

After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.

#### REFLECTION

Each week we leave our homes on a journey, we come to a blessed place, and we meet others on the same journey and in a wonderful way we become one people, united with one purpose, to give glory to God. We do this through the sacrifice of the Mass, a celebration of God's love for us and a reminder that, through the sacrifice of His son, Jesus, for our sins, we are forgiven, and we have the power to become the children of God. When we hear the word "sacrifice" lots of scenarios come to mind, the heroic death on the battlefield, the mother putting food on the table for her children but eating very little herself, the carer who puts the needs of another before themselves: but when we think about the sacrifice of the Mass do we feel the same sense of unselfish love as we do when we think about other sacrifices. Are we becoming immune to the meaning of the one true sacrifice?

Today's readings are full of another type of sacrifice, in the first reading we listen to the sacrifice of bullocks, poor dumb animals. In Hebrews this blood sacrifice is replaced by the perfect sacrifice of Our Lord for our sins. Sacrifices were part of the Old Covenant but now, today, we have a New Covenant, one made perfect by the sacrifice not of poor dumb animals but of the Son of God. Can you truly understand what is happening here?

Mark tells us clearly that at the Last Supper Jesus took bread and wine and, through the power of God, changed those simple earthly things into His Body and Blood and gave them to the Apostles as a free gift of His Love. This sacrifice continues today when our priest, says the Act of Consecration over the bread and wine that we have brought to the altar and then, through our communion, we receive the Body and Blood of Christ. The one true sacrifice made real by Jesus for us, and placed in our hands, given to us through His perfect love.

# The Body and Blood of Our Lord

Today we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

> At the Last Supper, Jesus changed bread and wine into His own Body and Blood. He has the power to do this because He is God. He did this because He wanted to stay with us even after He died and went into Heaven.


Jesus comes to us in every Mass. The priest takes the place of Jesus, saying the words that Jesus said at the Last Supper, and the bread and wine become the real Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus even though they still look like bread and wine.

#### How do I receive Communion well?

- 1. Be ready! Think about what is going to happen. Make sure that you don't have any big sins on your soul. If you do, then go to confession first.
- 2. Don't eat or drink anything other than water or medicine for an hour before going to Holy Communion. This is a sign of respect for Our Lord.
- 3. After receiving Holy Communion, take some time to thank Jesus for coming to you and talk to Him. He is your best friend and loves spending time with you!
