

The Lord God called to the man after he had eaten of the tree. 'Where are you?' he asked. 'I heard the sound of you in the garden;' he replied 'I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid.' Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

#### We are being trained to carry the weight of eternal glory

As we have the same spirit of faith that is mentioned in scripture – I believed, and therefore I spoke – we too believe and therefore we too speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus to life will raise us with Jesus in our turn, and put us by his side and you with us. You see, all this is for your benefit, so that the more grace is multiplied among people, the more thanksgiving there will be, to the glory of God. That is why there is no weakening on our part, and instead, though this outer man of ours may be falling into decay, the inner man is renewed day by day. Yes, the troubles which are soon over, though they weigh little, train us for the carrying of a weight of eternal glory which is out of all proportion to them. And so we have no eyes for things that are visible, but only for things that are invisible; for visible things last only for a time, and the invisible things are eternal.

For we know that when the tent that we live in on earth is folded up, there is a house built by God for us, an everlasting home not made by human hands, in the heavens.

#### Gospel Reading Mark 3:20-35

#### A kingdom divided against itself cannot stand

Jesus went home with his disciples, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind.

The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying, 'Beelzebul is in him' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either — it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house.

'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.' His mother and brothers now arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'

#### REFLECTION

"Out of the depths I cry unto you, O Lord."

I first heard today's psalm when I was very young. It came in the form of a prayer, the De Profundis, and it is one of those prayers that often comes to mind when I feel that I have let myself and others down through my behaviour. It is a penitential prayer; a cry to God for forgiveness. It left a lasting impression on me because it was so personal. It is I who cries out to the Lord, asking Him to listen to me, to hear me, to forgive me. I believe in the God of Love who is always ready to forgive and, even when it is difficult to forgive myself, I know He is the one who is listening, and that gives me comfort.

The psalm leads me to listen to Saint Paul when he speaks of the frailty of our earthly bodies. We are human and we face all the pressures that our humanity brings but we are also children of God and, though faith, we believe that we can face the troubles of this world. We can make our world a better place, a place where truth and harmony flourish by our efforts. This is the Christian life and one which we must try to embrace.

Today's Gospel contains what some believe is a serious criticism of Jesus. It is in two parts; the first part is an answer to the religious authorities about where His power over evil spirits comes from and the second part seems to condemn Jesus for his attitude to His family. The healing power of Jesus often speaks of "casting out devils". The Jews believed that illness, in its many forms, was the result of sin and that it could be passed down through the family of the one who sins, that in healing people Jesus was using the power of Satan. Jesus rebukes their argument for, if Satan is casting out devils, then he is defeating himself and it will lead to the end of his power. God's forgiveness is for all and, through His healing ministry, Jesus brings that forgiveness to fruition in the human family. The family of Jesus are concerned for his health and the attention he is attracting from the authorities. They try to persuade him to come home. When Jesus calls his followers his brothers and sisters. he is showing them that they are part of the family of God and that each one of them is precious to Him.
