THIS WEEK'S PARISH NEWS

JUBILEE 2025 - We're all invited into an encounter with Jesus Christ, as his disciples of mercy, forgiveness, and social action, and to celebrate our communities. The Holy Door will be open during this Year of Jubilee, where pilgrims are invited to enter and receive a plenary indulgence. The Jubilee indulgence, thanks to the power of prayer, is intended in a particular way for those who have gone before us, so that they may obtain full mercy. To gain a plenary indulgence, a person is invited to complete four specific acts: passing through a Holy Door, go to confession, receive the Eucharist, and pray for the intentions of the Pope. It's a way to show your commitment to living a better life and growing closer to God.

There will be an opportunity to join the scheme in March, the Parish benefits greatly from those who are members of the scheme, there is no cost to parishioners as the diocese claims the tax paid by Gift Aid members on their offertory donations from the government. First Reading: Deuteronomy 26:4-10

The confession of faith of the chosen people.

Moses spoke to the people: 'The priest shall take the basket from your hand and set it down before the altar of the Lord your God. And you shall make response before the Lord your God, "A wandering Aramean was my father. And he went down into Egypt and sojourned there, few in number, and there he became a nation, great, mighty, and populous. And the Egyptians treated us harshly and humiliated us and laid on us hard labour. Then we cried to the Lord, the God of our fathers, and the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. And the Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with great deeds of terror, with signs and wonders. And he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. And behold, now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground, which you, O Lord, have given me." And you shall set it down before the Lord your God and worship before the Lord your God.'

Response: Be with me, O Lord, in my distress.

Second Reading: Romans 10:8-13

The confession of faith of believers in Christ.

Brothers and Sisters: What does Scripture say? 'The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart' (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. For the Scripture says, 'Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame.' For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. For, 'everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'

Gospel Acclamation:

Glory and praise to you, O Christ. One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God. Glory and praise to you, O Christ.

Gospel Reading Luke 4:1-13

'Jesus was led by the Spirit in the wilderness and tempted by the devil'

At that time: Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And he ate nothing during those days. And when they were over, he was hungry.

The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread.' And Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "Man shall not live by bread alone."'

And the devil took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, and said to him, 'To you I will give all this authority and their glory, for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours.' And Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve."'

And he took him to Jerusalem and set him on the pinnacle of the temple and said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, "He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you", and "On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone." 'And Jesus answered him, 'It is said, "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test." '

And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from him until an opportune time.

REFLECTION

We are on a journey of discovery. It is the time in the Year of the Church when we experience an annual Lenten pilgrimage. A pilgrimage is a period when we have an opportunity to look more closely at ourselves and at our faith, if we want to know Our Lord more then this is a perfect time. We begin with a desert experience, deserts are not always places of sand, scrub and sun, they exist everywhere, even in the green places of our world, for the desert we will explore is one that exists within ourselves.

The people of the Exodus entered the desert walking hand in hand with God. Their journey through the wilderness lasted forty years, during this time they lived through the full range of human experience. They found and lost faith in God many times, but God never lost sight of them and journeyed with them throughout the long years of travel. In the Book of Deuteronomy Moses speaks to the people of a harvest, "the first of the fruit of the ground" which came forth from the land they had settled in after their exodus from Egypt. This harvest was a faith in God which would carry them through the long years ahead.

Seeking the Lord is not difficult, Paul tells us that "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" because it is through speaking of Jesus as Lord and believing in His resurrection in your heart that you will be saved. There are no barriers to belief, no distinction of race or colour, we reach towards faith by coming to know Our Lord through our experiences and actions. Listen carefully to the words of scripture and follow your heart for that is the way to Christ.

We are all subject to temptation, it comes in many forms and is subtle and appealing. It has an innocent look, and we often do not realise we are being deceived until it is too late. Through the wilderness experiences of Our Lord, we can begin to discern how easy it is to fall into temptation's trap. Jesus was taught scripture from his childhood and understood the temptations of humanity for status and power. As we listen today to the Gospel of Luke, we can take heart from the reaction of Jesus to His temptation and learn how to overcome those human temptations that we face in our daily life.
