<u>Iopic</u> <u>Theme and</u> <u>Intent</u>	Students will study the topic of 'Myself and others'. This will cover giving basic information about yourself including name and age, learning numbers 1-100, saying when your birthday is, talking about family, describing your own appearance and personality, describing appearance and personality of others and giving opinions and justifications. This will also include an introduction and overview of the Spanish speaking world.	Students will study the topic of 'free-time and leisure'. This will include learning music and sport in the Spanish speaking world, understanding Christmas traditions in Spain, saying what you like and don't like to do and why, referring to what you eat and drink, talking about the weather, saying what sports you do and referring to what activities you will do in the future.	Students will study the topic of 'My local area'. This will include describing what your area is like, talking about what there is in your area, telling the time, saying what you do in your area, learning how to order food and drink, talking about what you did in your area in the past, what you will do in your area in the future and learning about cities in Spanish speaking countries.

Students will build on skills from module one by understanding justified opinions in different forms of written and spoken language, transcribing longer sentences, expressing justified opinions in written and oral communication and using a range of structure to extend and connect, translating short text and manipulating grammar to refer to the present and future tense.	Students will build on skills from previous modules by understanding greater detail in extended spoken and written language, transcribing sentences with two tenses, using accurate pronunciation, translating longer written text, manipulating grammar to refer to two timeframes with a larger range of verbs in written and oral communication and using a larger range of structures to extend and connect.
