<u>Topic Theme and Intent</u>	Photography – Students will look at the work of David Bailey, John Stezaker, Annie Liebowitz and produce photographic collages inspired by their work. Drawing and painting – students will learn about portraiture and the proportions and features of the face. They will create their own portrait and integrate their own patterns inspired by the work of Gustav Klimt, Julian Opie, Mary Cassatt and Jenny Saville.	Art Textiles – Students will be introduced to basic art textile skills. They will study the work of Hundertwasser and produce work inspired by the artist. Students will produce a final collaged piece using felt and other materials and embellish it using basic running stitch	<b>3D Design –</b> Students will be introduced to 3D sculptors <b>Claes Oldenburg</b> and <b>Rachel Whiteread.</b> They will design a sculpture based around the theme of food. They will build a small prototype of their model using clay.
