Topic Theme and Intent	Students will study the topic of 'My town' which will include learning how to say what there is and isn't in your town, understand information about French and francophone towns and cities, understand and give directions, say where you normally go on a weekend, what activities you can do in your town and what you would like to have in your town.	Students will study the topic of 'Holidays' which will include learning how to say where you normally go on holiday and what you do there, talk about future holiday plans and activities, describe your routine to get ready, read French menus and deal with the currency and describe future ambitions.	Students will study the topic of 'Media and technology' which will include learning how to give opinions about different TV programs, give film preferences with reasons, talk about different book genres and what you read normally, say what you do on the Internet and how often and say what you did last night using the past tense.

This includes: listening for gist and detail, transcribing and translating longer sentences, taking part in longer conversations, expressing ideas in both speech and writing, speaking confidently with fairly accurate pronunciation, understanding texts from a range of sources (including literary texts) and translating sentences into English.	Students will develop skills from Module 1 but with the new knowledge base. 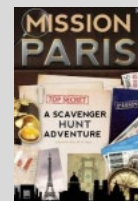
