A very ambitious piece of artwork has been completed by the art department to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of EMS.

The aim was to involve as many students and staff as possible and pull together an ever-lasting work of art. Staff and students were tasked to make their mark (doodle, name, initials etc) on individual ceramic stars. After all marks had been made on all individual stars large- scale mosaics were arranged. Eight individual mosaics, illustrating 1973 to 2023, have been finalised and are to be permanently installed in the entrance of the art department for all to see.

The project worked with 5, Year 5 students from each Partner Primary School. Once completed, plaques will be displayed at English Martyrs and each Primary school will have a plaque to celebrate their involvement.



## **GCSE** and A Level exhibitions

The annual GCSE and A Level shows at the English Martyrs Catholic School and Sixth Form College has once again celebrated the future generation of artists and designers. Some students who exhibited are progressing to higher education institutions to pursue creative careers undertaking degree courses in Illustration, Photography, Fashion and Advertising.

Putting their talents in the spotlight, over 100 students showcased their works from a wide range of courses at the exhibition including Art and Design, Photography, 3D Design and Graphic Design.

On display were pieces that have been inspired by maritime history, voyage and cartography.



## **Primary Arts Project**

As part of our extensive and exciting transition to Secondary School work Art staff have led and ambitious project of transition. Staff visited 6 Primary schools across Hartlepool working with all year 6 students, 270 students in total.

Schools involved were Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School, St Bega's Catholic Primary School, St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, St John Vianney, St Cuthbert's Catholic Primary School and St Teresa's Catholic Primary School.

Primary Arts 2023, allowed EMS art staff to visit Primary Schools, work alongside Primary staff and for every student to produce an illustrated digital portrait. The project was influenced by the work of British artist Michael Craig Martin encouraging students to explore and experiment with iPads and digital media. Every student involved absolutely loved the experience and really enjoyed being taught by a teacher from their desired Secondary school.

All outcomes will be displayed on the large screens around EMS and each visiting Primary school will receive an official framed Big Draw certificate documenting their participation in the project.

It was a pleasure visiting Year 6, being able to get to know them, work a long side them and start build positive relationships that we aim to enhance when they officially join in September.




### **Artist in Focus**
