

Pupils and staff at English Martyrs are celebrating after receiving a prestigious Artsmark Award in a momentous year for the programme as it celebrates 20 years of arts, culture and creativity in schools.

The Artsmark Award is the only creative quality standard for schools, accredited by Arts Council England. It supports schools to develop and celebrate arts and cultural education, putting creativity and wellbeing at the heart of the curriculum. Artsmark ensures every young person can be creative and access a diverse, high-quality cultural education.

The Artsmark assessor commended "EMS clearly have a long-term commitment to arts and culture which is beginning to have measurable effects on staff and pupils. All pupils can access a diverse and consistent range of arts and cultural provision through work with local arts and cultural organisations, both in school and on visits

outside the classroom, which leads to showcasing in school and the local community".

Record breaking results

English Martyrs Catholic School and Sixth Form College is celebrating a record-breaking set of Art and Design results.

The results achieved by year 11 GCSE Art and Design students were above those ever-recorded pre-pandemic in school and the percentage of 9-8 and 9-7 grades was also higher than those of last year.

This year: GCSE

- 21% of grades were 9's
- 40% of grades were 9-8's
- 51% of grades were 9-7's
- 100% of cohort achieved 9-6's

Catholic Trust Annual Primary Arts Project

As part of our extensive and dynamic transition to Secondary School Art staff have continued an ambitious project to support Secondary readiness. Staff visited 6 Primary schools across Hartlepool working with all year 6 students, 270 students in total.

Schools involved were Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School, St Bega's Catholic Primary School, St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, St John Vianney, St Cuthbert's Catholic Primary School and St Teresa's Catholic Primary School.

Primary Arts 2023, collaborated with Primary teachers so that every student produced an illustrated digital portrait. The project was influenced by the work of British artist Michael Craig Martin encouraging students to explore and experiment with iPads and digital media. Every student involved absolutely loved the experience and really enjoyed being taught by a teacher from their desired Secondary school.

All portraits were displayed on the large screens around EMS and each visiting Primary school will receive an official framed Big Draw certificate documenting their participation in the project. Large banners were printed to display all students' portraits and are on display in the Art department and the main school building. It was a pleasure visiting Year 6, being able to get to know them, to work alongside them and give them an insight into what art looks like at EMS.





















Celebrating 50 years of EMS

All Catholic Primary Partner Schools were invited to take part in the making of commemorative plaques for our schools' 50th Anniversary.

Year 5 students from each Partner Primary School worked on the project to creating deigns that showcased their school's ethos. All designs were then realised in clay. Students from Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School, St Bega's Catholic Primary School, St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, St John Vianney's Catholic Primary School, St Cuthbert's Catholic Primary School and St Teresa's Catholic Primary School all attended afternoon sessions to create their pieces. Students engaged and excelled with this project. All students represented their schools' extremely well with excellent talent and teamwork.

Final pieces were finally gifted to all visiting Catholic Primary Head teachers for them to take away and display in their schools.



Art Remembrance Art Work

To commemorate this year's Remembrance Day a group of Key Stage 3 SEND students took part in an art and ceramic focussed enrichment group. Accompanied by Miss. Shale students explored various potential designs on paper prior to working with clay. Students experimented with varying shapes, scale and carving methods.

Finally work was left to dry, kiln fired, hand painted and framed and is now displayed in the SEND department.

Key Stage 3 Bishop Hogarth Catholic Education Trust Photography competition

Key stage 3 students were invited to creatively respond to set themes in a Trust wide photography competition. Students responded to the themes of Faith, Perspectives, Portraits, Nature, Identity, Colour, Manmade and Sense of Place.

Responses were positive with many students submitting work for the competition. Entries were judged and prizes were awarded to the chosen students. Students selected as finalists were Jack Ord, Charlotte Bage and Millie Palmer. Jack Ord was victorious and won the Sense of Place category receiving a first prize amazon voucher. All work was featured in a trust wide exhibition. The exhibition was held at Our Lady and St. Bede's Catholic Academy Stockton 22nd November.

The event was brilliant with representation from all trust schools championing the time and effort on display.









The Big Draw 2023: Drawing with Senses

The 2023 Big Draw Festival theme

#DrawingwithSenses changes the focus from external to internal, exploring the way we personally process the world and internalise our experiences through our senses. This is a great year to look at the 5 basic senses: Touch, Sight, Sound, Taste and Smell and experiment with these and those you are less familiar with to transpose your experiences into creative work and drawings in 2023.



The art department are working with Miss. Shale, an art trained teaching assistant, and SEND students on this project. Students are exploring and experimenting various drawing techniques and approaches whilst taking influence from their senses such as drawing to music, drawing with eyes closed. Students have approached this years theme exceptionally well, feeling inspired, having fun and enjoying the process.

3D Art Workshops

The art department have offered two full day 3D art workshops.

Miss. Bown and Mr. Carless have been working with all year 10 GCSE Art and Design students supporting their portraiture coursework units. Both teachers carefully guided students through the design, build and decoration stages culminating in personal sculptures.

All year 10 GCSE Art and Design students have been exploring and investigating the work of Gustav Klimt and have endeavoured to create ceramic responses.

Miss Bown said "I love being part of such an energetic atmosphere and having that extra time with my year 10's to really explore and refine technique, especially in a practical subject as art, is incredible".



Mrs. York said "The trip was a perfect mix of the culture and the social, allowing both Art and Spanish students to really take something meaningful away from the experience".




















Artist in Focus
