Inspired by Pope Francis's encyclical Laudato Si. The event brought together students, educators, and community members to engage with the profound message of care for the planet and its inhabitants. the poor, the youth, indigenous peoples, and the natural world, attendees embarked on a transformative journey towards sustainability and social justice.

Good Friday Walk of Witness




Many of our school community were involved in the Holy Family Parish's Walk of Witness on Good Friday. This began at each of our churches and finished at Victory Square.

The Feast of the English Martyrs



Year 13 Leavers' Liturgy





Pentecost





Next academic, faith leaders will be working collaboratively with staff and students in developing the Catholic Life of the school.


Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle




English Martyrs were delighted to attend and celebrate Mass at St Mary's Cathedral for the intentions of students and staff within our diocese.
