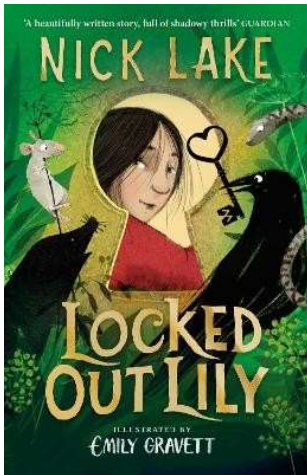


A selection of books especially selected for children in Year 6.

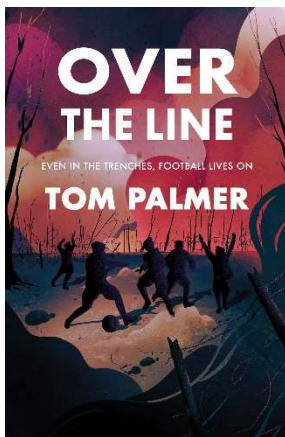

Author: Nick Lake **Release Date:** 04/08/2022

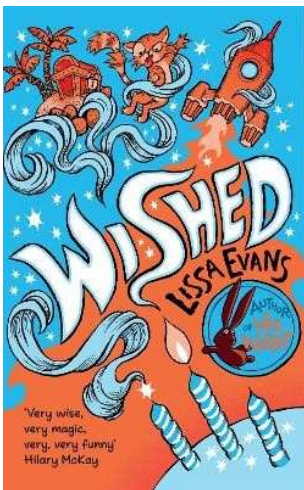

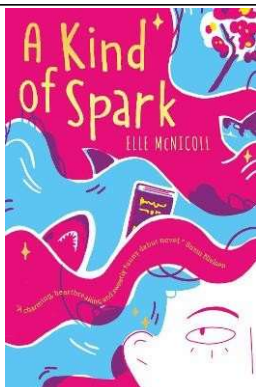


Me, My Dad and the End of the Rainbow
