

Year 11

Students will prepare for their post-secondary education and career paths. They will receive guidance on college applications, apprenticeships, and other training opportunities. Mock interviews and career readiness workshops will help them feel confident as they approach the end of their secondary education. By the end of Year 11, students will have a well-rounded view of their career possibilities and the steps they need to take to achieve their goals.

Year 10

Year 10 is a critical time for gaining practical experience. Students will participate in work experience placements, giving them a real-world understanding of different careers. They will also continue to refine their CVs and cover letters, and practice interview skills. Workshops on financial literacy, such as budgeting and understanding paychecks, will be introduced to prepare students for future employment.

Year 9

Students will make important decisions about their future study pathways. They will receive guidance on selecting their GCSE subjects, understanding how these choices impact their career options. Career fairs and one-on-one advisory sessions will provide deeper insights into various professions. Students will also begin to develop their CVs and learn about job application processes.

Year 8

Year 8 focuses on building upon the interests and skills identified in Year 7. Students will have the opportunity to engage in more detailed career research, including guest speaker sessions and workplace visits. They will start to learn about the importance of employability skills such as teamwork, communication, and problemsolving. By the end of the year, students should have a clearer understanding of how their current studies relate to future career options.
