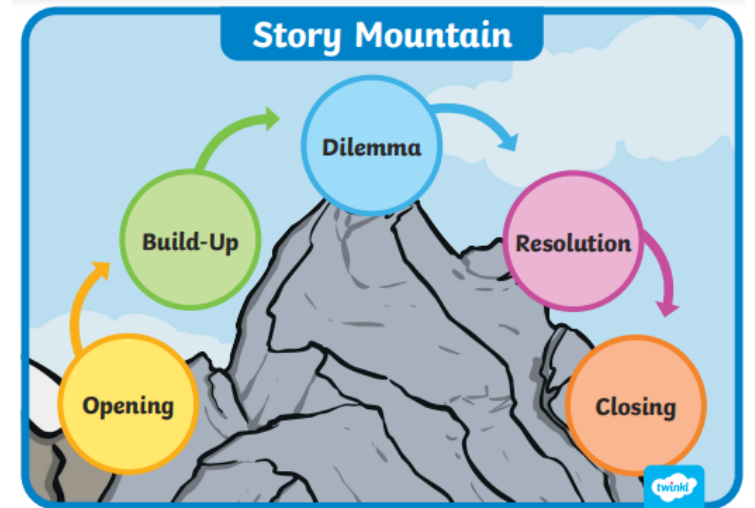

ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY	
Narrative	a spoken or written account of connected events; a story.
Fiction	literature in the form of <u>prose</u> that describes <u>imaginary</u> events and people.
Norse	relating to ancient or medieval Norway or Scandinavia.
Co-ordinating conjunction	A word used to join two independent clauses together.
Sub-ordinating conjunction	“a word such as 'although', 'because', or 'when' which begins a subordinate clause”
Mythical creature	an imaginary creature usually having various human and animal parts.

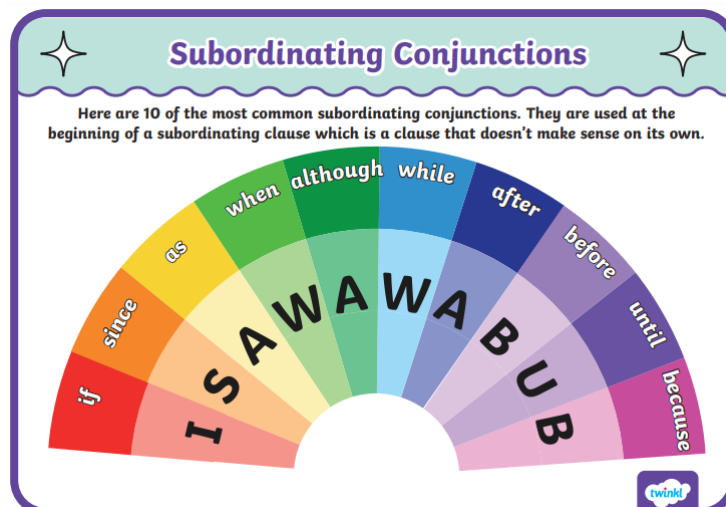

Pronouns	I	You	She, he, or a character's name
Example	I opened the door and breathed in the cool air.	If you're looking for the best article on point of view, you've found it.	Luca bought himself an ice cream with three scoops.
