	ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY
Backstop	Stands behind the batter and catches the ball if the batter hits it behind.
Batter	Hits the ball and tries to scores points and is part of the batting team.
Fielding	Working as part of a team to prevent the batters from scoring points.
Bowler	.Throws the ball for the batter to hit and is part of the fielding team.
Collect	Pick up or retrieve the ball.
Fielder	Stands in a space on the field and collects the ball the batter has hit and is part of the fielding team.
Tactics	Things a team would do to try and beat the opposite team.
Stump	The fielding team would try to hit the stump with the ball to stop the batting team.
Track	Follow the ball and/or players on the opposing team.
Team mate	A person that is on the same team as you.
Hit	When a batter hits a ball.
Out	When a member of the fielding team catches or stops the ball the batter is then out.
