We call this oral history. ❑ You can find out what life was like in the recent past through looking at photographs or objects. ❑ Many toys today are similar to those played with by grandparents. ❑ Toys today are usually made from different materials than in the past, for example plastic instead of wood or metal. ❑ Some grandparents didn't have the electronic toys you have today. ❑ Shops today are usually much bigger than when some grandparents were children. We call them supermarkets.. ❑ Some grandparents mainly learned about the 3 'Rs' reading, writing and arithmetic. You learn about lots of different subjects.
