

#### YEAR 3

We have been very busy in year 3 the last couple of weeks! We have done lots of exciting outdoor learning, including taking our guided reading sessions outdoors. We have just finished reading Flat Stanley and The Great Egyptian Grave Robbery. We loved being able to have our discussions outdoors. We have also been looking at 'plants and growth' as part of our science topic this term. We were very excited to be able to start growing our own runner beans to explore what plants need to grow. We have been caring for them and watering them as often as we can – especially when it does not rain! Finally, we have been learning about the Ancient Egyptians and what achievements they made

during the Egyptian era. As part of our lessons, we looked at Hieroglyphs and artefacts. It was lots of fun!









YEAR 4
We have had
another busy term

in year 4. We have been enjoying the sunshine (when it has appeared) and in one lesson, we did an invertebrate hunt. This was linked to our science learning all about 'Living Things'. We have learnt about living things such as plants, animals and humans. We discovered the difference between a vertebrate and invertebrate. Invertebrates are largely made up of bugs and insects so the children completed a scavenger hunt to find and classify the insects. We went searching in our bug hotel, under rocks, under pieces of wood, in trees and in our vegetable patch. It was great fun! Miss Oudnie was very brave at picking some of them up and sharing with the children although some were a little bit wary too!

Year 4 have also been very busy preparing for their multiplication check this term, which is the first week after half term. Miss Pickering has been so proud of our progress and says: "Don't forget to practice over the break".





#### Year 5

Year 5 have enjoyed learning about the scientist Mary Anning this term and wrote a biography about her life. In maths we have been learning about finding the area and perimeter of a rectilinear or compound shape. The children have been very enthusiastic about designing their own game in our computing sessions. They had to choose a theme, and how to win points or lose a life. We had an exciting visit from the astronomy roadshow planetarium to link with our science topic about space. We have been learning about day and night and different international time zones. In Geography Year 5 have been focusing on the topic of mountains and the pros and cons of visiting the Alps.

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#### There is a vacancy for a parent governor on the school's governing board.

#### What is a Parent Governor?

The definition of a parent governor, is a person who is elected as a member of the Governing Board of the school, by parents of registered pupils at the school and who is a parent at the time of their election. Governors come from all walks of life and bring a rich variety of skills and experience to schools. What Governors at Holy Family School have in common, is a passion for education and a commitment to furthering the life chances of all of the young people we serve.

#### School governors have a varied and important role .....

Helping the school run effectively. They have three core functions:

Planning the strategic direction of the school

- Overseeing financial performance of the school and ensuring money is well spent
- Holding the head teacher or school leadership to account

The governor role is strategic rather than operational. Governors don't get involved with the day to day running of a school, instead supporting and challenging the school's leadership team to drive school improvement.

Governors usually attend around six meetings a year. Governor visits are needed too. Being a school governor is a commitment and a responsibility but offers you the chance to see first-hand the impact you can make in improving education for children in your community. As a parent governor, your role is;

To bring a **parental perspective** to the issues discussed – you're not there to speak 'on behalf' of the parent body Apart from that, no different from other governors.

At the Holy family School we are committed to equality, diversity and inclusion for all applicants and the wider community. We want to create an environment which represents the surrounding communities. We would like anyone who is used to going to meetings and giving a viewpoint to consider applying. We encourage applications from all members of society, regardless of background, gender, ethnicity, disability or age (as long as you are over 18).

Please click here to complete the form for expression of interest.

You will need to ask another parent of a pupil to sign the form. Please be aware that regulations require everyone elected or appointed to a governing body to undergo a pre-appointment check which will include a criminal background check. This is to ensure the safety of the pupils. If you are elected and you subsequently decline to undergo such a check, you will disqualify yourself.

Please give brief details of yourself of no more than 80 words on the form. If an election is needed these details will be copied and sent to all parents with the ballot papers. Please note that the 80 word limit will be strictly enforced and result in additional wording being deleted. If the number of nominations is the same as or less than the number of vacancies, then the person nominated will be deemed elected unopposed. If there are not enough nominations, the governing body has the duty to appoint parent governors to fill the remaining vacancy.

The governing body has determined that the term of office for a parent governor is 4 years. If you are elected you may serve the full term of office even if your child leaves the school before your term of office finishes. If an election is necessary we will send you a ballot paper on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> March 2023, closing date Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March 2023. Only parents of children registered at the school are entitled to stand or vote in the election. A parent who is paid to work at the school for more than 500 hours in a school year or is an elected member of the LA may not stand for election. Each parent will be sent one ballot paper regardless of how many children they have at the school, and each parent will have one vote per vacancy. The ballot will be secret and you will be notified of the result as soon as possible afterwards. In most cases it will be obvious whether you are a parent. For the purposes of the election of a parent governor, a parent is:

Parents (including carers) of registered pupils at the school. "Parent" is defined for the purposes of the Constitution Regulations as including "any individual who has or has had parental responsibility for, or cares or has cared for, a child or young person under the age of 18". It includes a person who the child lives with or who looks after the child, irrespective of what their relationship is with the child. The reference in the definition must be someone involved in the full-time care of the child on a settled basis.
