

Parking

Please do not stop in the middle of the road to drop your child off as the road outside gets very busy and this causes a queue of traffic. Please be considerate to local residents when parking. Do not park on the grass verges, across resident's driveways, between our school parking signs or directly opposite the school gates. Hertfordshire Constabulary are monitoring this across the county and have advised schools that parking tickets will be issued.

We have also had reports of parents parking in Quickbeams which has resulted in a local resident's disabled access being blocked. Please do not not park where you will obstruct local resident's access.

Please remember that we operate an unofficial one way system at pick up and drop off times entering from the Rowans end of Crookhams.

We encourage families to walk to school where possible. Alternatively, there is a hard standing carpark at the lagoon opposite the Crookhams turning.


Reception

In Reception, we baked cupcakes as part of our `celebrations' topic. We used our mathematical skills of weighing and measuring. We also applied our scientific skills while carrying out an experiment. We have been learning about materials, including changing materials, we observed how the dough changes in the oven while testing out the best recipe. We also used our art skills when we decorated our cupcakes.

In our math's lessons this week we have been working on understanding heavier, lighter and the same weight. We have faced a challenge to find items that will balance when we put them on the scales. We also enjoyed our geography where we were learning about the continent of Asia and we made panda masks.








Year 2


Tables for sorting


In our maths lesson today we learnt about what tables are and how they can be used to help us to sort information. Miss Parmley told us what a Carroll Diagram was and explained that it is a table that ask us questions to sort out information or objects.

We then had to sort out 2D and 3D shapes into a Carroll Diagram. We used statements like: Can see a triangle and cannot see a triangle, can see a square and cannot see a square. We then worked as a table to come up with our own ways of sorting the shapes.
