We are going to practising our Times Tables, ready for the summer test!

We will be covering a range of subject areas this half term as outlined below.

English	Due to the children enjoying our class novel so much we are going to

	This half term in English, the children will begin with a unit on		
	explanation texts, where they will ultimately design an explanation piece		
	to describe an invention they have created. We will look at texts such as		
	Until I Met Dudley by Roger McGough and Rosie Revere Engineer by		
	Andrea Beaty. We will then be reading "The Day I Swapped My Dad for		
	Two Goldfish" by Neil Gaiman which will inspire our topic on persuasive		
	writing. The children will ultimately create a persuasive text to convince		
	someone to attend a venue of their design.
