

Examples of writing description in first person

Remember to use a comma after an adjective if using more than one.

Descriptive writing features

- Adjectives
- Adverbs (a word or phrase that <u>modifies</u> or <u>qualifies</u> an adjective, verb, or other adverb) "The door creaked loudly every time it was opened"
- Figurative language (similes, metaphors, etc.)
- Specific detail (e.g., the cosy, yellow sofa was in the corner of the room, right next to the roaring, glorious fireplace).
- Writing that is about the senses (smell, taste, touch, see, hear)
