ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY	
Seasons	The year is divided into four seasons: spring, summer, autumn and winter.
Weather	The state of the atmosphere at a particular place and time.
Change	Something that is different.
Satellite	An artificial body placed in <u>orbit</u> round the earth or moon or another planet in order to collect information or for communication.
Torrents	Strong and fast movement of water.
Tides	The alternate rising and falling of the sea, usually twice in each <u>lunar</u> day at a particular place, due to the attraction of the moon and sun.
Thaw	A period of warm weather that thaws ice and snow.
Observe	Notice that something has happened.
Predict	Say or guess something that might happen.
Climate	Weather conditions in a particular place.
Region	An area or part of a country in the world.
United Kingdom	Made up of England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales. Sometimes known as the UK.
