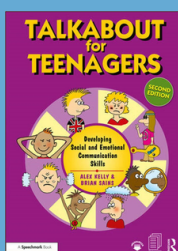
Pupil Passports

At the beginning of each term, you will receive a message on Class Charts letting you know that your child's Pupil Passport is available to view. The message will include a link so you can log into Provision Map and see the live passport. This document shows your child's current targets and the strategies staff use to support them in lessons. If you would like to, you can also leave a comment on your child's passport so we can continue to work together to meet their needs.



Interventions

At TKAW we offer a wide range of interventions to support pupils in many different areas of need. Each term, this newsletter will focus on a different type of support so that families can understand what is available. In this issue, we are highlighting our Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) interventions. These interventions aim to build confidence, develop positive relationships, and support pupils in managing their emotions both in and out of the classroom.



Talkabout for Teenagers, a programme that helps pupils develop their social and communication skills. The sessions build confidence, support friendships, and give practical tools for everyday situations.



ELSA support helps pupils understand and manage their emotions, build confidence, and develop positive relationships through gentle, focused activities.



The Drawing and Talking therapeutic intervention allows individuals to discover and communicate emotions through a non-directed technique.



Lego Therapy sessions use teamwork and problem-solving activities to help pupils build communication skills, strengthen relationships, and grow in confidence.

Wolverhampton SEND Local Offer helps parent carers and their children aged 0 to 25 years who have special educational needs or disabilities (SEND) find information and services that can help support them.
