

## KAT KEY STAGE OVERVIEW (Long Term Planning)

Rationale (with end points): By the end of year 7 students will be have partaken in 3 projects, that not only allow for a base line understanding of art principles but then for an opportunity to expand this learning in the final two projects. Initially learners will be introduced to the 7 elements of art, allowing for an inclusive learning experience, due to some students having a lack of art lessons when in primary school. The newly absorbed information (line, colour, tone, shape, form, space & texture) will be marked accordingly at the end of the project. Students are then introduced to their first project in its entirety (Aboriginal Art) in which they will focus on the historical value of this art form and produce a well-rounded form of research, that will inform their final piece design that documents secondary research findings and uses technical language throughout. Once research has been obtained by students, they will then begin experimenting with appropriate materials (this may vary based on the skills of the learner and to differentiate the learning experience). This will also allow for an introduction to the materials being used in their final piece. Once students are ready they will plan a final piece that is then complete using the required resources, selecting from a range of designs and then creating a suitable outcome. Once the project is complete, learners will then evaluate their own final piece, based on their findings. The evaluation will use a template that forces students to use precise technical language in an investigative manner. Finally, learners will begin following the same methods in order to complete their second project, exploring the art movement Pointillism. Learners are purposefully given the same project template in order to gain a sense of confidence/comfort and to then allow them to produce a final outcome using newly explored materials. In the case of Pointillism, students will be creating their own work that uses the methods accessed in the art movement.
