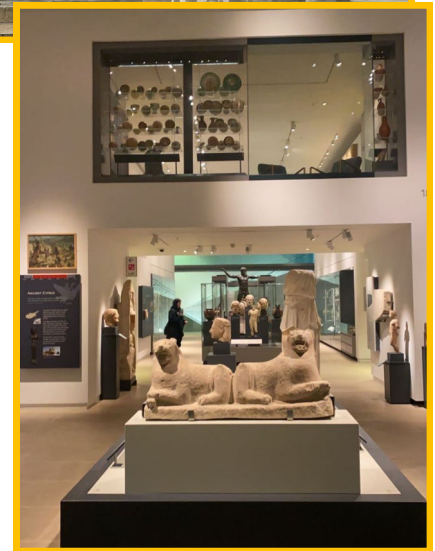

Year 12 students engaged in the Oxford raising aspirations workshop, where they were informed of the types of personal statements that make applicants appealing to Oxford university and what university life involves.

Following the workshop students were offered the opportunity to visit the Ashmolean Museum and Oxford university, during which students explored a variety of artefacts which played a pivotal role in shaping modern society.

A theatre company performed their exceptional version of a Christmas carol for years 11,12 and 13. They captured the importance of Christmas spirit and the positive implications of helping one another, allowing students to reflect on how they can be more selfless individuals.
