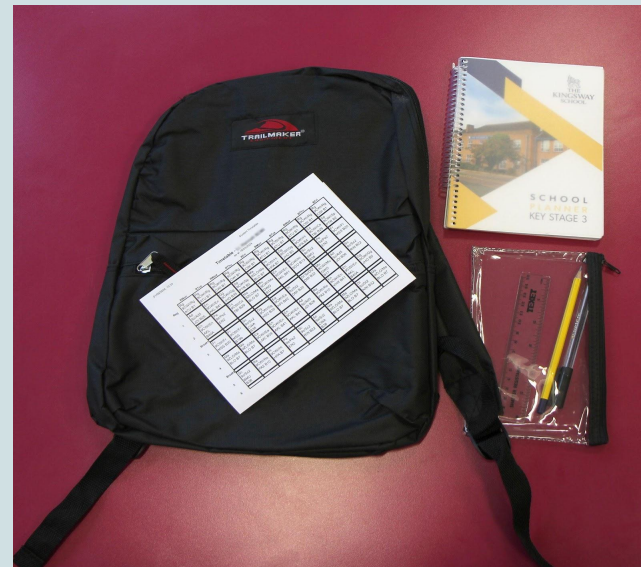
Standards: Is your child ready to learn?

WAYS YOU CAN SUPPORT

Here are some tips for helping your son/daughter achieve their best in their forthcoming GCSE exams:

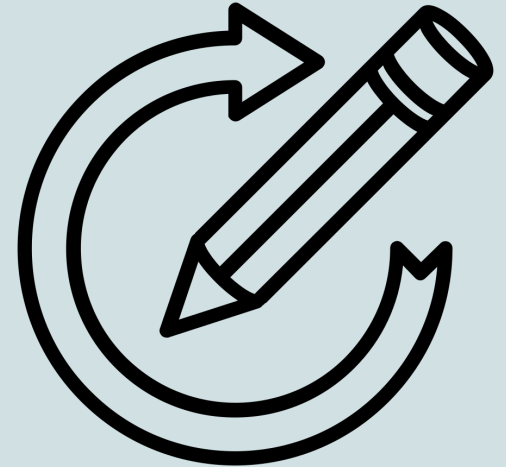
1. **Concerns** – If you are at all concerned about their progress, please do not hesitate to contact us if you need any extra support. Email [Year 11.Pastoral@kingsway.stockport.sch.uk](mailto:Year11.Pastoral@kingsway.stockport.sch.uk)
2. **Talk to your child** – how can you support them? What will they find helpful?
3. **Attendance** – Ensure that your son/daughter is in school on time daily.
4. **Flexibility** – Agree the balance between work and social life and stick to the agreement.
5. **Be realistic** – Use the 80/20 rule. If your son/daughter is sticking to what they are supposed to be doing 80% of the time, they will be well prepared.
6. **Revision Timetable** – Help your child to stick to their revision timetable. Crossing off days and exams as they are completed helps psychologically.

Remember to include 'down time' in each week's plan.

Top Tips for making a Revision Timetable



- Make a study timetable
- Colour code different activities
- Use a range of revision techniques
- Spread your subjects out evenly
- Do each subject in a 20-30 minute 'block'
- Plan in short breaks where possible
- Give yourself 'down time' - relax as well as revise
- Plan revision over a longer period - don't leave it until the last minute

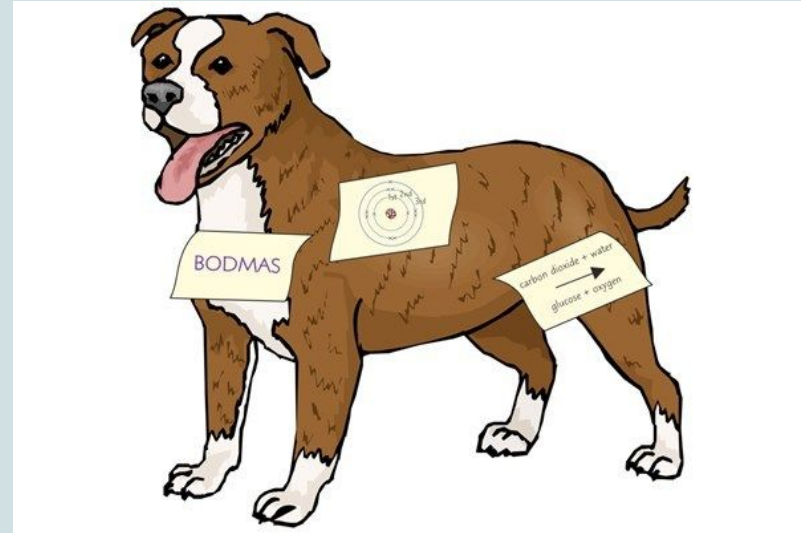

Exam Conditions

What you must do during every exam

From F46 to the Hall

-  Once you leave F46, you are under exam conditions.
-  Walk to the Sports Hall in silence.
-  Enter the Sports Hall in silence.

During the Exam

-  Remain in silence until you return to F46 after the exam to collect your bag.
-  No communication at all — no talking, turning around or gestures.
-  If you need help, raise your hand and a teacher will come to you.

Important Reminders

-  No phones, devices, watches, smart watches, AirPods or earbuds.
-  Water is allowed, but it must be in a clear bottle with no label.
-  Listen carefully to the senior leader reading the exam instructions and follow them.

 **Stay silent. Follow instructions. Give yourself the best chance to succeed.**

Morning Exam Routine


What to do before a morning exam

1. Before You Leave Broadway

1  Go to Period 1 as normal


2  Arrive promptly at 8.55am


3  Teacher takes the register


4  Check you have a pen, pencil and a ruler for your exam


5  Wait for Mrs Francis to collect your class


2. Walking to Foxland

6  Class teacher will escort your class out of the Broadway exit


7  Class teacher will remain at the front of the class for the walk to Foxland


8  Use the crossing – do not cross the road elsewhere


9  Walk around the back of Foxland Campus to the tennis courts


10  Line up on the tennis courts in silence and in single file


3. At Foxland

11  F47/48 students line up closest to the tennis court entrance

12  Once all classes have arrived, Mrs Francis will take F47/48 students to drop bags off in F46

13  Each class will then be escorted by their class teacher to F46 to drop their bags off

14  Use this as a final opportunity to check you have the equipment you need

15  Exit F46 and make your way to the Sports Hall in silence



Be ready. Stay calm. Move sensibly and follow staff instructions.

For Period 3 & 4 exams







Before you leave Broadway

- 1  Go to Period 3 as normal
- 2  Arrive promptly at 11.20am
- 3  Your teacher will take the register
- 4  Check you have: pen, pencil and ruler
- 5  Wait for Mrs Francis to collect your class

Walking to Foxland

- 6  Your class teacher will escort you out of the Broadway exit
- 7  Your class teacher stays at the front of the line
- 8  Use the crossing – do not cross the road anywhere else
- 9  Walk around the back of Foxland Campus to the tennis courts

When you arrive

- 10  Line up on the tennis courts in silence and in single file
- 11  F47/48 students line up closest to the tennis court entrance
- 12  Mrs Francis will take F47/48 students to F46 to drop bags off first
- 13  Each class will then be escorted by their teacher to F46 to drop bags off
- 14  Use this as a final chance to check your equipment
- 15  Leave F46 and walk to the Sports Hall in silence

End of Exam Routine

What to do when the exam finishes

When the exam ends

-  The senior leader will end the exam and read the instructions
-  You must remain in silence
-  You will be dismissed row by row and taken to F46 to get your things

Leaving the Sports Hall

-  The next row will be dismissed as soon as F46 is clear
-  Your teacher will escort you out of the back of F46 and take you back to Broadway
-  Your teacher must stay at the front of the class for the walk back

Back at Broadway

-  You will re-enter Broadway Campus via the green gate
-  You will stay outside on the yard until the bell goes
-  When the bell goes, you can either stay outside or make your way inside

 **Stay calm. Stay silent. Follow staff instructions all the way back to Broadway.**

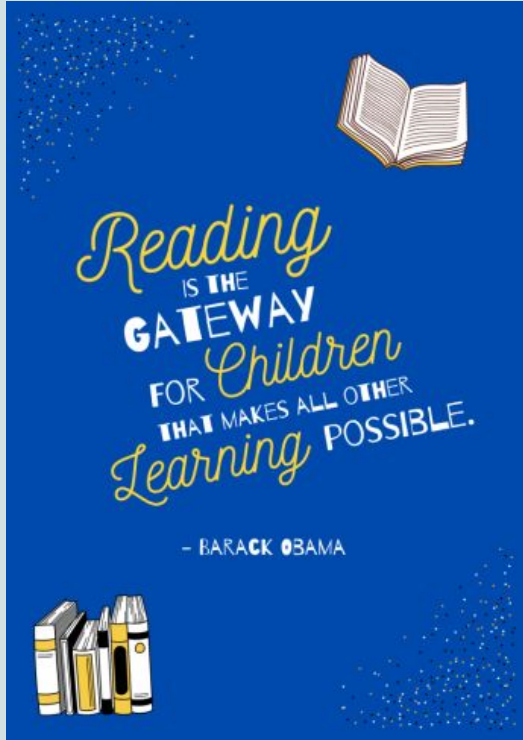

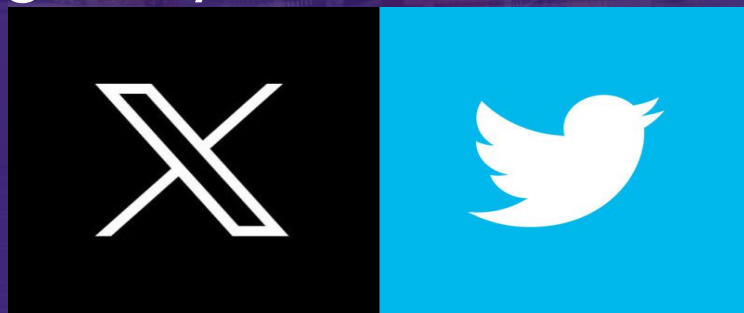

6. Inappropriate entries will be removed

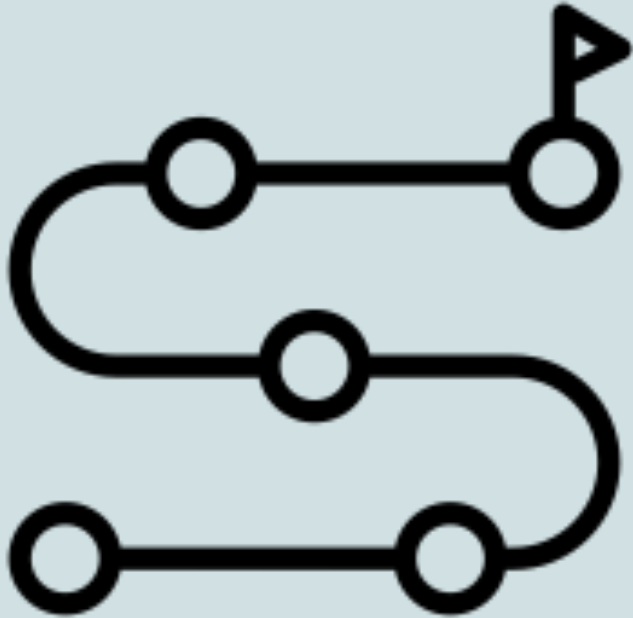
Any team with an inappropriate name or unclear manager details will be removed from the league or excluded from prizes.

These sessions are carefully planned by subject specialists to focus on key knowledge, exam technique and common misconceptions identified from assessments and PPE examinations. They give students valuable guided practice, immediate feedback and the opportunity to ask questions in a focused learning environment.

Educational research consistently shows that structured revision, regular attendance and teacher guided support have a positive impact on student progress and examination outcomes. Students who attend school and intervention sessions regularly are typically better prepared, more confident and achieve stronger GCSE results.

We strongly encourage all students to take full advantage of the support available in school over the coming weeks, as consistent attendance and active participation can make a significant difference to final outcomes.

Year 11 Prom



Suite Information & Requirements

- **Card Only** - Just a polite reminder, Stockport County are a cashless stadium and so all bars are card only.
- **No Alcohol** - Please note that no alcohol will be served or permitted at any point during the event.
- **Bag Checks** - All guests' bags will be subject to a security search upon arrival. Any alcohol brought to the prom will be confiscated. Possession of illegal substances will result in confiscation and may be reported to appropriate authorities.

Car Parking & Arrival Information

- We would advise, 1 hour before the start time of the Prom for the arrival of the prom guests.
- **Parking for Staff, Parents & Guardians**
Parking will be available for staff and Parents/Guardians (who are wishing to stay and watch the arrival), this will be in the Vitality Railway End Car Park, which is located at the far end of Hardcastle Road. From there, they should proceed to the spectator area on foot. We recommend to all, arriving earlier than the prom guests to avoid getting caught in the congestion of all the other arrival methods of transport.
Please note, you may need to wait until all the Prom arrivals have finished before leaving the car park.
- **Entrance & Exit Routes**
All vehicles must enter via Hardcastle Road (off Dale Street) and exit through Caroline Street onto Mercian Way.
- **Prom Transport Drop-Off**
Any method of transport, dropping off prom guests should use the designated '**Drop Off Point**' which is past the Cheadle End Car Park and located on Hardcastle Road. It will be clearly marked on the day.
Prom guests upon exiting their method of transport, should make their way through the entrance on Hardcastle Road and head into the stadium where they can await their peers and take photos Pitch Side or with our new PROM display. They will then be directed to the event space by a member of Edgeley Park Staff, once they have been advised the arrival is complete.
- **On-Site Support**
Stewarding and Edgeley Park Staff will be on hand to help direct traffic and assist with the smooth flow of vehicles.
