Something to think about this week...

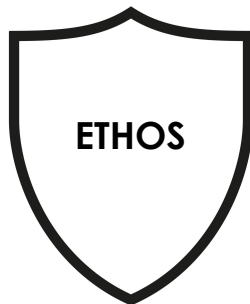


This week is cycle to school week so we are promoting coming on your bike to school.

3. Always tidy away your rubbish and unwanted food.



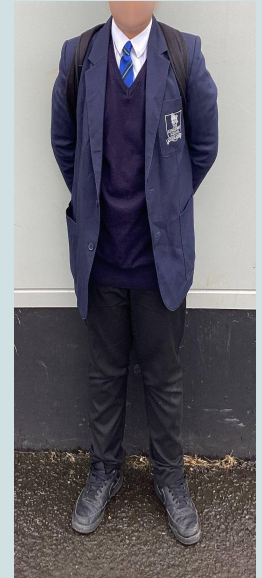

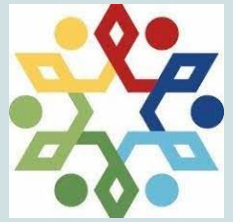


Wearing our school uniform proudly is important because it allows us to demonstrate our very high standards and expectations.

Top Tips

(from KS4 students)



1. Use the pedestrian crossing to cross Broadway road as it is busy with cars.
2. If you are on your bike, come off it at the subway ramp and walk it through the subway. Dismount on entry to school as well.
3. Keep to the left when in the subway.





4. If your route takes you past Foxland campus, stay on the path and cross the road at Silverdale carefully (looking in both directions for oncoming traffic).

5. The route to Scholes Park/Gatley Primary is a busy one so walk sensibly and where you can allow families with small children access safe passage.

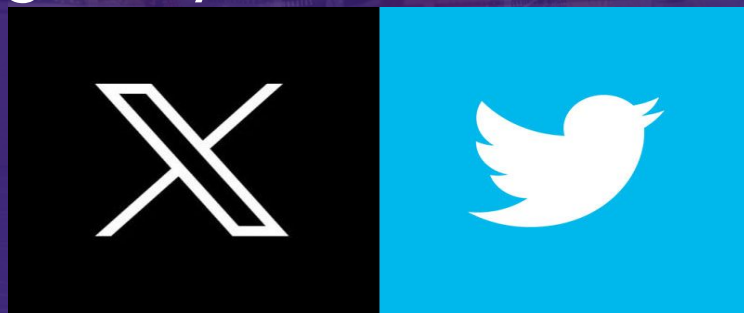

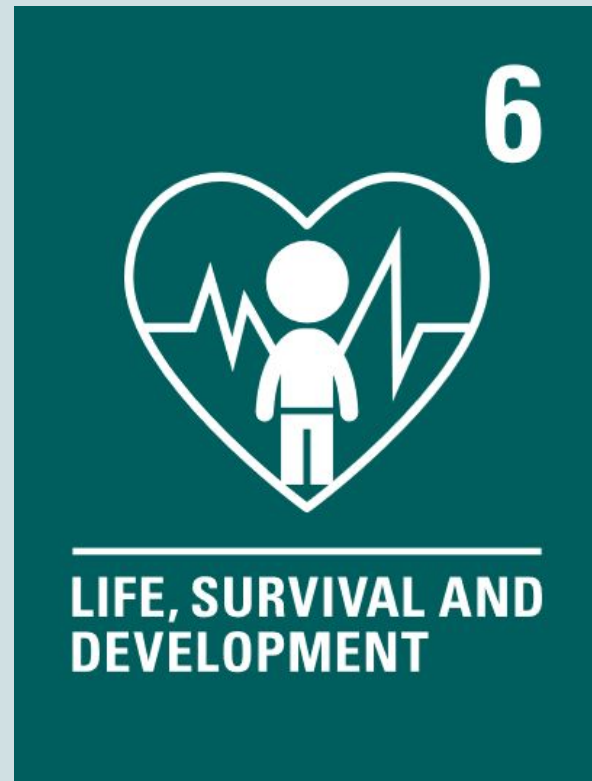

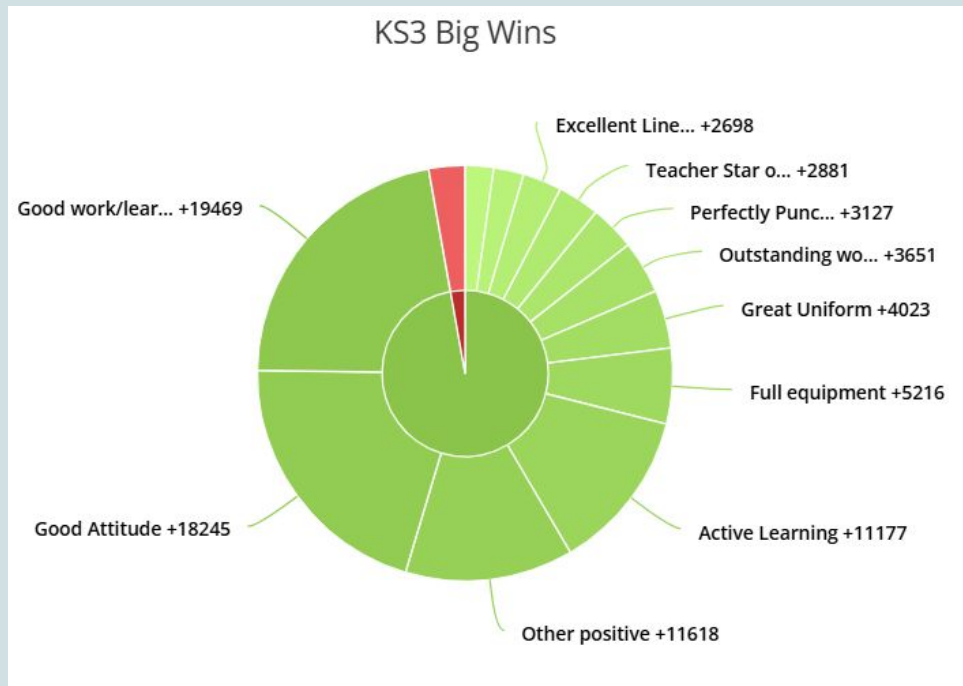

Once a term, the TKA meet with members of the school leadership team to review bids and agree how funds are spent.

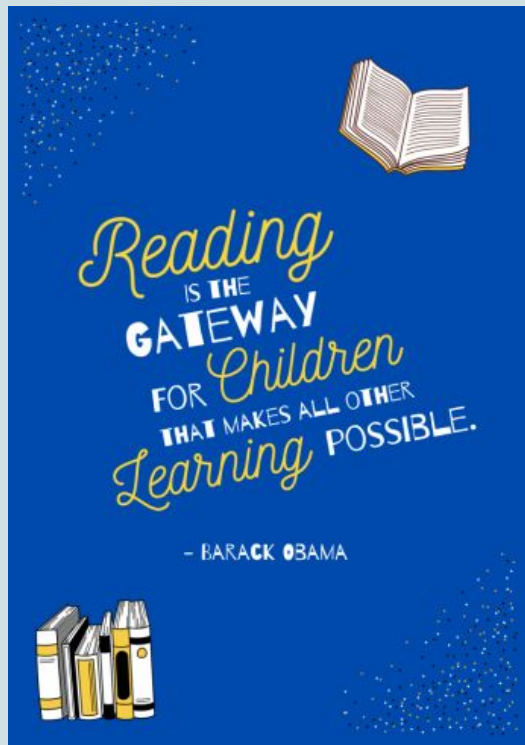
