


Global Impact: Since the epidemic began, over 35 million people have died from AIDS-related illnesses, and an estimated 40.8 million people are living with HIV globally today.






Compassion What is a foodbank and why do people use them?



A food bank is a non-profit organisation that collects and distributes food to people struggling to afford food.

- A simple box of food makes a big difference, with food banks helping prevent crime, housing loss, family breakdown and mental health problems.
- Given the current financial challenges, more households are using foodbanks.







Items to bring in



The foodbank has worked with nutritionists to ensure food parcels contain sufficient nutrition for at least three days worth of healthy, balanced meals for individuals and families.

A TYPICAL FOOD PARCEL INCLUDES:

- Breakfast cereals
- Soup
- Pasta
- Pasta sauce
- Tinned beans
- Tinned meat
- Tinned vegetables
- Potatoes
- Tinned fruit
- Tinned tomatoes

- Tinned fish

- Sugar
- Biscuits
- Snacks and treats (as available)
- Toiletry items including soap, shampoo, toothpaste
- Nappies and baby wipes





In every subject area, you will be given an 'essential knowledge sheet' at the start of each unit of work. You'll recognise it as they are all on purple paper.


These sheets are REALLY important as they tell you all the essential knowledge you will ACQUIRE and APPLY in each subject this HT.




Rewards Event: Important information for Parents/Carers
