

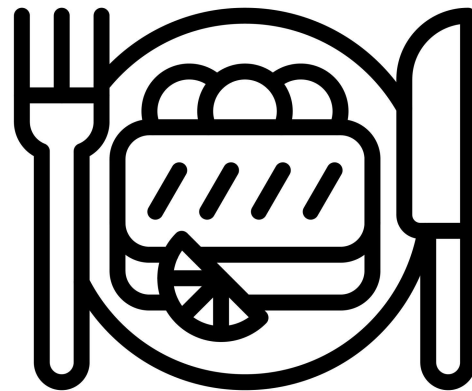

CORNERSTONE CURRICULUM PREVIEW

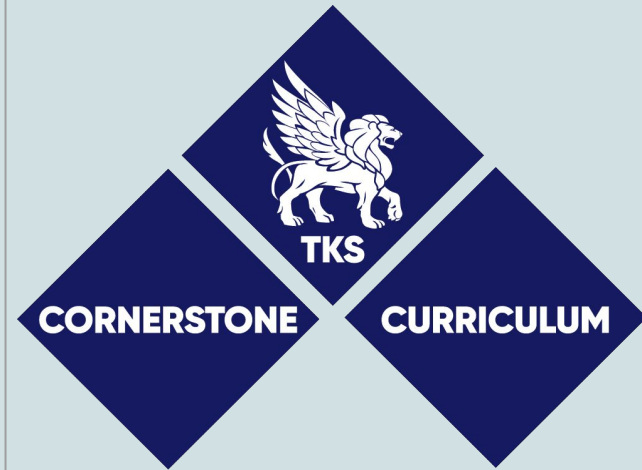
Essential Knowledge

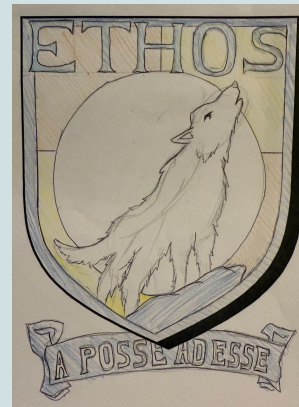

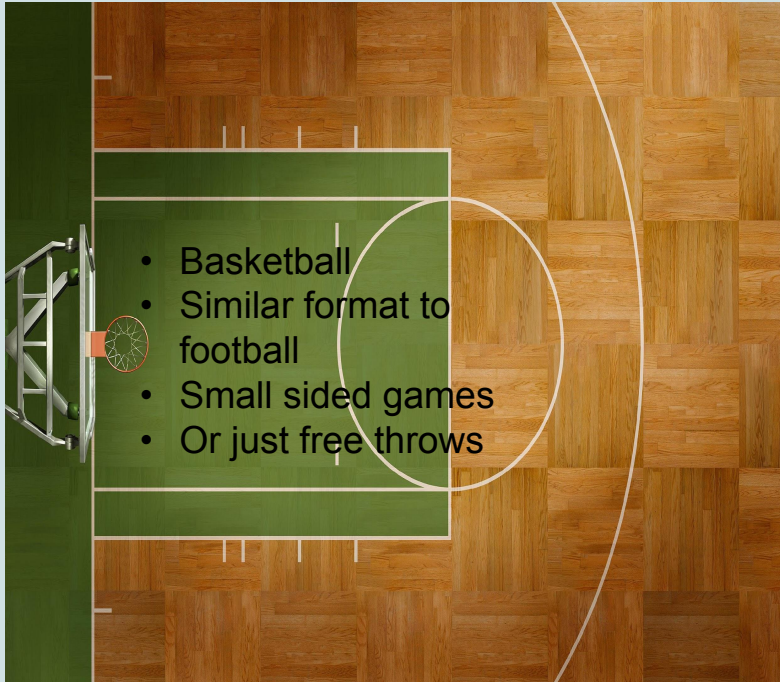
