Be mindful of others: Keep pets indoors and show respect for neighbours and the community.



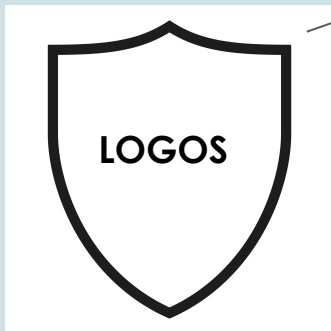

We're nearly at the end of the first half term! Thank you to all students who have visited the library over the past weeks and enjoyed what we have to offer. More to come next half term!

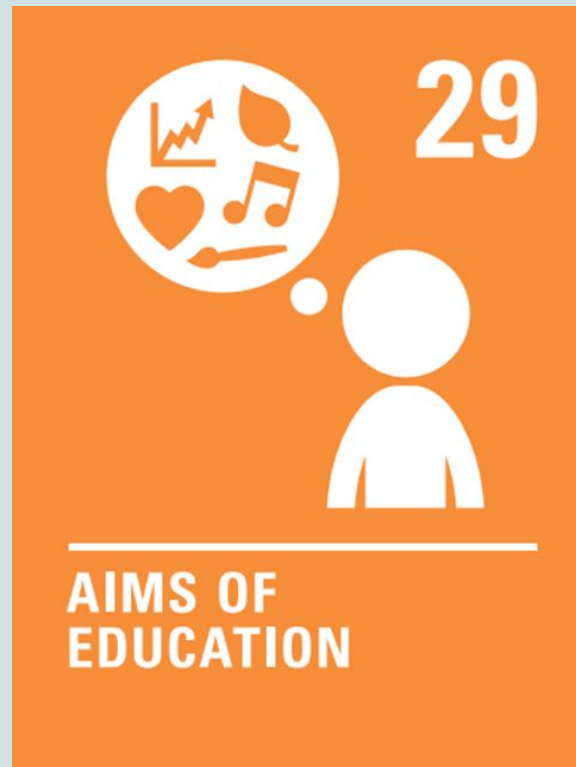
- **IMPORTANT!** - It is possible to borrow books until early next week, but all books must now be returned to the library by Thursday 23rd October, at the latest.

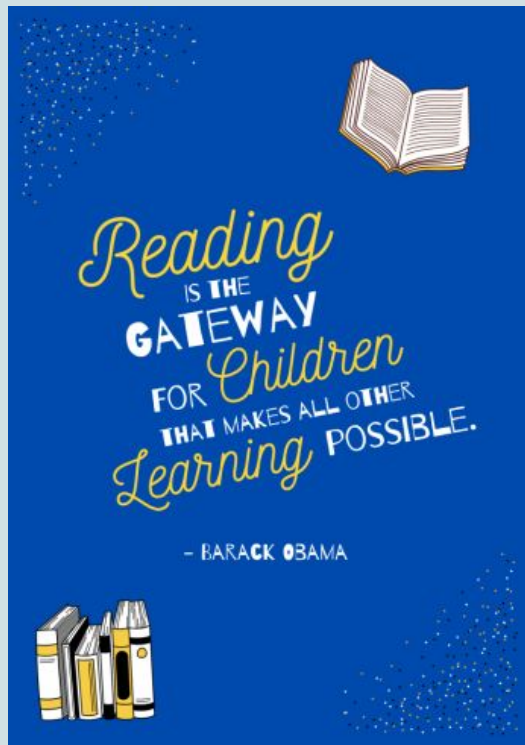

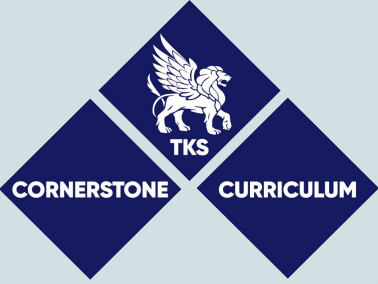

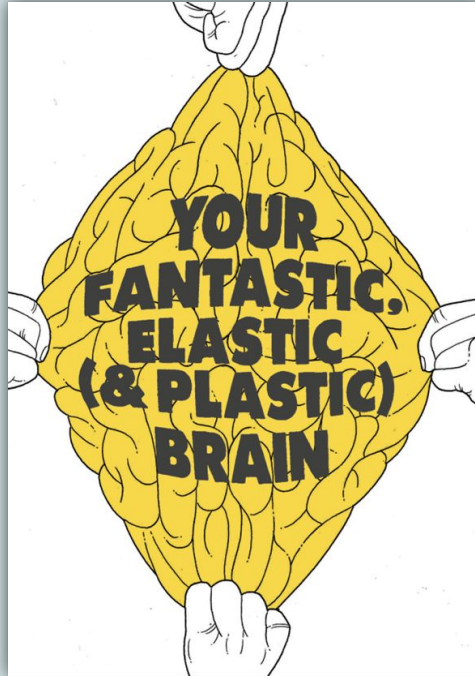

Cornerstone Curriculum: Preview



We can shape up our brain just like we can shape up our body. Think of it as a mental muscle. If we put the brain through a fitness programme that helps to build neural pathways, we can mould it into something truly incredible. And the more we push ourselves, the more connections we make and the stronger they become. Scientists have a name for this. Wait for it... it's called...

NEURO-PLASTICITY
