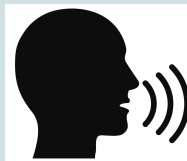

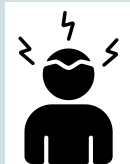

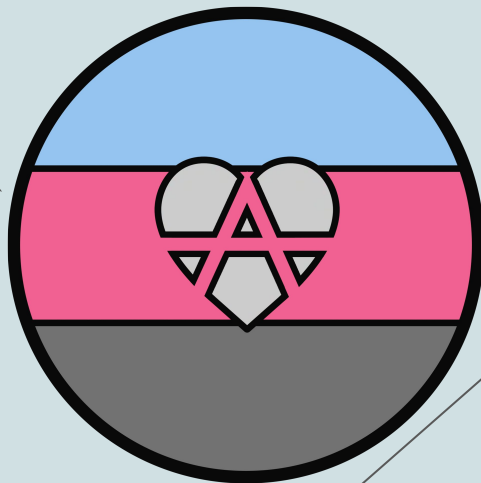

Cornerstone Curriculum: Respecting others

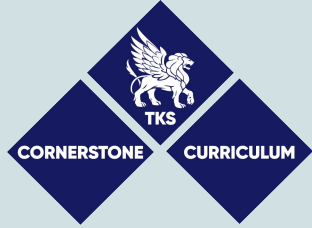


In our Cornerstone curriculum we have been learning about “Virtue Ethics” which philosophers such as Aristotle attributed to the development of a person’s character.

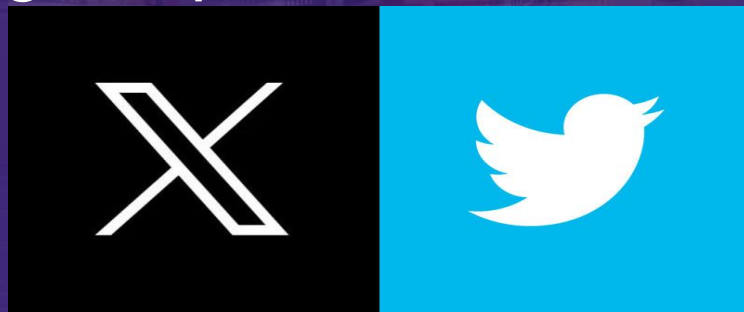

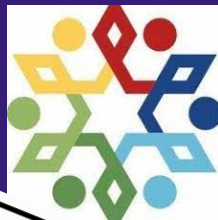

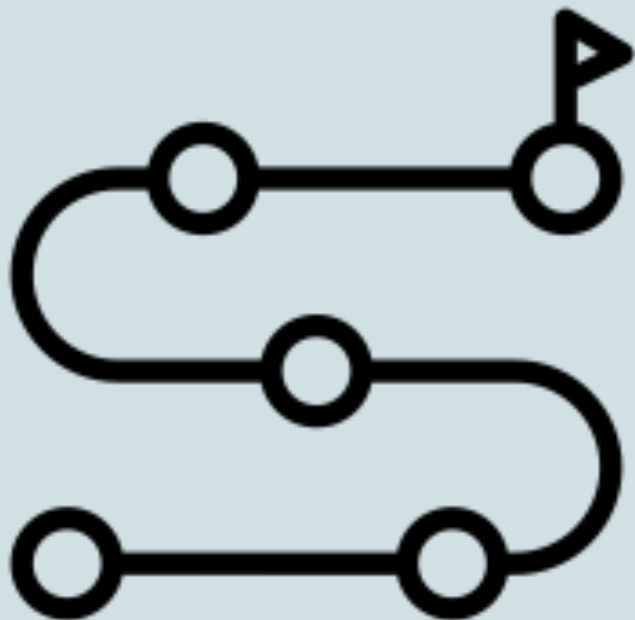
‘Essential Knowledge Sheets’

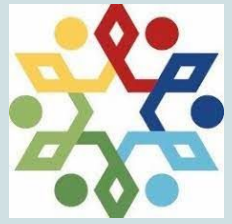
