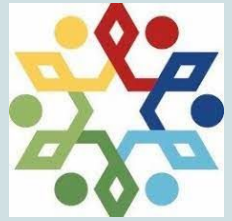

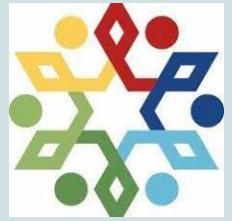
THURSDAY is a BIG DAY for our Y11 students, who get the results of their Mock GCSE exams. They also have their parent's evening.

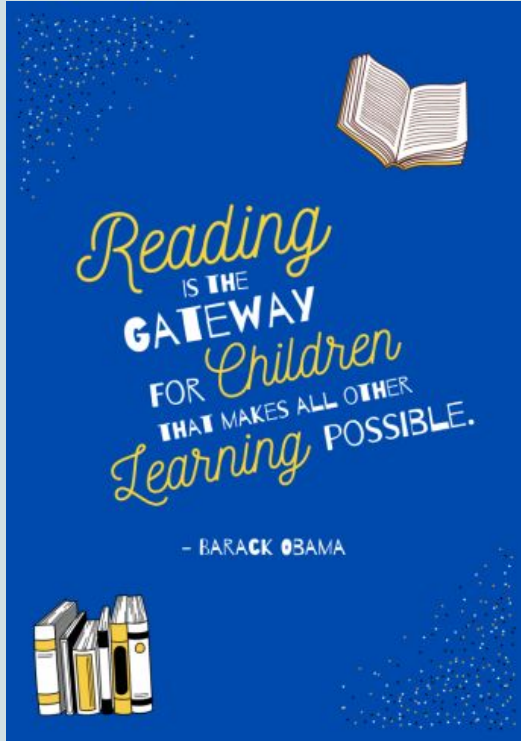
Big Wins

Ready-Respect-Safe Punctuality

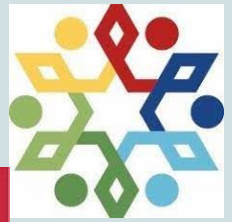

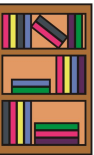
Broadway Library: **Ready, Respect, Safe**

A reminder of behaviour expectations for those wishing to use the Library

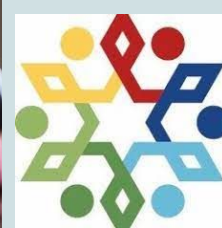
Broadway Library is, first and foremost, for reading, although some students also like doing the quiet guided and independent activities on offer. While it is understandable that students want somewhere else other than outside to be with their friends, especially during the colder months, the library **must** be respected as a space for students to relax, do calm activities and enjoy what the library has to offer for short periods of time during their day. Behaviour expectations are below. Students who are not following this will be asked to leave and reflect for some time before visiting again.

- **Students should enter the library quietly with coats off and no food or drink. Large groups of students will not be allowed in together.**
- **Students will now need to sign into the library on their year group sheet when visiting. This will be checked against classcharts, so that merits can be given for making good behaviour choices and any inappropriate behaviour responded to if necessary**
- **It is a rule of the library that students tidy up after themselves when the whistle goes. This involves replacing books and resources where they were found and tucking in chairs.**

NOTE: Students are kindly asked to borrow and return books early during break times or after school.



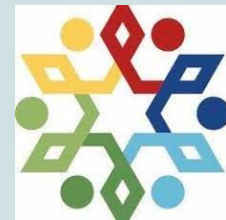
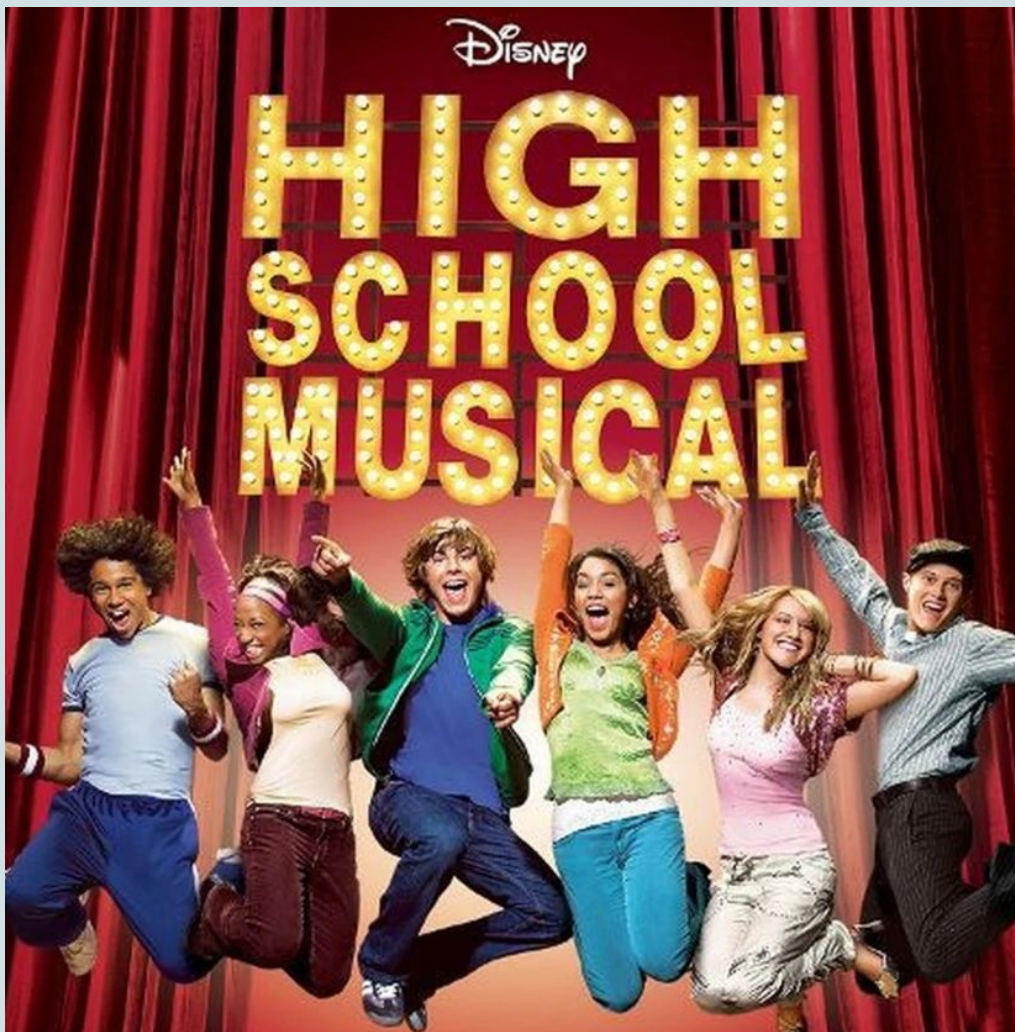

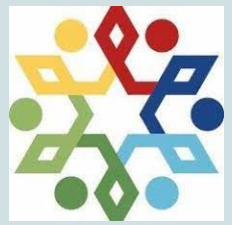
At TKS, you will often hear your teachers talk about your 'learning journey' and the key bits of 'essential knowledge' you will learn as you move through school.

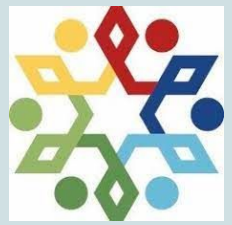

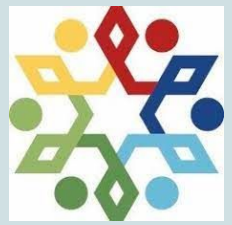
