Big Wins






Our first rewards event of 2025 has taken place with over 470 KS3 students qualifying and attending our Tenpin Bowling Trip.

Ready-Respect-Safe



Are you always "Ready to Learn"?

If you are a student who has received a C3 recently (which includes a 15 min SDR) you need to consider the following:

- 1. What caused this consequence and how can you ensure that you will be successful next lesson?
- 2. Was the C3 issued because you were off task, not fully engaged in the task set or for something else?
- 3. Were you able to fully discuss the consequence at your 15 min SDR.

Attendance (the same day an SDR is set) is important as it allows you to discuss the issue with a teacher, reflect on the choices you made, repair the issue so that the next lesson is a fresh start for you and the chance to earn positive points and feel successful in your learning.

If you have any concerns relating to your lessons, please do speak to your subject teacher, form tutor, HOY/PHOY. Do also speak to your parent/carer who can always contact your form tutor for further support. Form tutor emails are in the front of your planner for reference.





Respect



Having respect for your own learning is recognised through your approach to learning.

Your latest report judges the respect you have to your own learning via your "Approach" score.

Each subject teacher has judged your approach out of 5. If you achieve a score of a 5, it means you demonstrate exemplary behaviour in the classroom, take every opportunity outside of the classroom and stretch and challenge yourself as a learner (especially with your accomplishments in home learning).

ACTION:

Review your Approach scores when you receive your Report. Analyse the subjects where your Approach score is high. This indicates that you have a high level of respect for that subject/ teacher and are engaged in your learning which means you are likely to progress.
